- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the state industrial
- 2 commission and the agencies under the management of the industrial commission; to authorize
- 3 transfers; to provide an exemption; to create and enact a new section to chapter 6-09.17 and a
- 4 new subsection to section 54-17-07.3 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to partnership
- 5 in assisting community expansion fund incentive limitations and a housing finance agency
- 6 program for residential housing in rural communities; to amend and reenact subsection 6 of
- 7 section 6-09-15 and section 6-09.17-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the
- 8 powers of the Bank of North Dakota and the biodiesel partnership in assisting community
- 9 expansion fund; to provide legislative intent; to provide an appropriation; to provide a contingent
- 10 appropriation; to provide an expiration date; and to declare an emergency.

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

10	of management and budget for the purpose of repaying the Bank of North Dakota for loans and
11	accrued interest relating to funds borrowed for centers of excellence, for the biennium
12	beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009.
13	SECTION 8. EXEMPTION. The amount appropriated to the Bank of North Dakota in
14	the capital assets line item in sections 3 and 6 of 2005 Senate Bill No. 2014 is not subject to the
15	provisions of section 54-44.1-11. Any unexpended funds from this appropriation are available
16	for construction of a new building during the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending
17	June 30, 2009.
18	SECTION 9. TRANSFER. The sum of \$80,195, or so much of the sum as may be
19	necessary, included in the special funds appropriation line item in subdivision 1 of section 3 of
20	this Act, is from the North Dakota mill and elevator association. The moneys must be
21	transferred during the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009, upon order
22	of the state industrial commission.
23	SECTION 10. TRANSFER. The sum of \$102,066, or so much of the sum as may be
24	necessary, included in the special funds appropriation line item in subdivision 1 of section 3 of
25	this Act, is from the accumulated and undivided profits of the Bank of North Dakota. The
26	moneys must be transferred during the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30,
27	2009, upon order of the state industrial commission.
28	SECTION 11. TRANSFER. The sum of \$69,259, or so much of the sum as may be
29	necessary, included in the special funds appropriation line item in subdivision 1 of section 3 of
30	this Act, is from the housing finance agency fund. The moneys must be transferred during the

SECTION 6. APPROPRIATION - EMERGENCY COMMISSION APPROVAL. In

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- 1 biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009, upon order of the state industrial 2 commission.
 - **SECTION 12. TRANSFER.** The sum of \$21,872, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, included in the special funds appropriation line item in subdivision 1 of section 3 of this Act, is from the revenues of the public finance authority. The available moneys must be transferred during the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009, upon order of the state industrial commission.
- SECTION 13. LANDS AND MINERALS TRUST FUND TRANSFER TO THE GENERAL FUND. During the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009, the 10 director of the office of management and budget is authorized to transfer special funds from the 11 lands and minerals trust fund to the general fund in the amount of \$15,000,000.

SECTION 14. BANK OF NORTH DAKOTA TRANSFERS TO STATE GENERAL **FUND.** During the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009, the industrial commission shall transfer to the state general fund \$60,000,000 from the current earnings and the accumulated undivided profits of the Bank of North Dakota. The moneys must be transferred in the amounts and at the times requested by the director of the office of management and budget. A transfer authorized may only be made to the extent the transfer does not reduce the Bank's capital structure below \$175,000,000.

SECTION 15. STUDENT LOAN TRUST FUND TRANSFER TO THE GENERAL **FUND.** The industrial commission shall transfer to the general fund in the state treasury the sum of \$3,100,000 of earnings from the North Dakota student loan trust fund. The moneys must be transferred in the amounts and at the times requested by the director of the office of management and budget during the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009, and upon certification by the student loan trust trustee that sufficient moneys remain available to pay all debt service on student loan trust bonds, all required rebate payments to the United States treasury, and all program operating expenses.

SECTION 16. INCOME AUTHORIZATION - STUDENT LOAN TRUST. There is authorized the receipt of fees by the state industrial commission in the sum of \$91,131, or so much of the sum as is owed, included in the special funds appropriation line item in subdivision 1 of section 3 of this Act, from the student loan trust for administrative services rendered by the state industrial commission to the extent permitted by sections 54-17-24 and

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1 54-17-25. The fees must be received during the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending 2 June 30, 2009, upon order of the state industrial commission.

SECTION 17. LIGNITE RESEARCH, DEVELOPMENT, AND MARKETING PROGRAM - APPROPRIATION - LIGNITE MARKETING FEASIBILITY STUDY. The amount of \$1,500,000, or so much of the amount as may be necessary, included in the grants and special funds appropriation line item in subdivision 1 of section 3 of this Act, is appropriated from the lignite research fund for the purpose of contracting for an independent, nonmatching lignite marketing feasibility study or studies that determine those focused priority areas where near-term, market-driven projects, activities, or processes will generate matching private 10 industry investment and have the most potential of preserving existing lignite production and 11 industry jobs or that will lead to increased development of lignite and its products and create 12 new lignite industry jobs and economic growth for the general welfare of this state. Moneys 13 appropriated pursuant to this section may also be used for the purpose of contracting for 14 nonmatching studies and activities in support of the lignite vision 21 program; for litigation that 15 may be necessary to protect and promote the continued development of lignite resources; for 16 nonmatching externality studies and activities in externality proceedings; or other marketing, 17 environmental, or transmission activities that assist with marketing of lignite-based electricity 18 and lignite-based byproducts. Moneys not needed for the purposes stated in this section are 19 available to the commission for funding projects, processes, or activities under the lignite 20 research, development, and marketing program.

SECTION 18. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - BANK PROPERTY. It is the intent of the sixtieth legislative assembly that real estate property owned by the Bank of North Dakota at 1205-1215 west main street in Bismarck not be sold by the Bank of North Dakota during the 2007-09 biennium.

25 SECTION 19. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - BOND PAYMENTS. The amount of 26 \$29,475,016 included in subdivision 1 of section 3 of this Act in the grants - bond payments line 27 item must be paid from the following funding sources during the biennium beginning July 1, 28 2007, and ending June 30, 2009:

SECTION 20. APPROPRIATION - TRANSFER. The funds appropriated in subdivision 3 of section 3 of this Act must be transferred by the Bank of North Dakota to the partnership in assisting community expansion fund; the agriculture partnership in assisting community expansion fund; and the biofuels partnership in assisting community expansion fund. The Bank of North Dakota may not be construed to be a general fund agency because of the appropriation made by subdivision 3 of section 3 of this Act.

SECTION 21. TRANSFER AUTHORITY. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Bank of North Dakota may transfer any unobligated funds between funds that have been appropriated by the legislative assembly for partnership in assisting community expansion fund and the biofuels partnership in assisting community expansion fund.

SECTION 22. TRANSFER - BUDGET SECTION APPROVAL. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Bank of North Dakota may transfer any unobligated funds that have been appropriated by the legislative assembly for the medical partnership in assisting community expansion fund to the partnership in assisting community expansion fund, upon approval by the budget section.

1	SECTION 23. AMENDMENT. Subsection 6 of section 6-09-15 of the North Dakota
2	Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
3	6. Lease, assign, sell, exchange, transfer, convey, grant, pledge, or mortgage all real
4	and personal property, title to which has been acquired in any manner.
5	SECTION 24. AMENDMENT. Section 6-09.17-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is
6	amended and reenacted as follows:
7	6-09.17-02. Biodiesel partnership in assisting community expansion fund -
8	Continuing appropriation - Administration. A biodiesel partnership in assisting community
9	expansion fund is hereby established. All moneys transferred into the fund, interest on fund
10	moneys, and payments to the fund are hereby appropriated for the purposes of this chapter.
11	This fund is <u>not</u> subject to section 54-44.1-11 and any unexpended and unobligated balance in
2	the fund at the end of the biennium must be transferred to the state general fund biofuels
13	partnership in assisting community expansion fund. The Bank of North Dakota shall administer
14	the fund.
15	SECTION 25. A new section to chapter 6-09.17 of the North Dakota Century Code is
16	created and enacted as follows:
7	Partnership in assisting community expansion fund incentive limitation. A
8	biodiesel production facility or ethanol production facility that receives interest buydown from
19	the biofuels partnership in assisting community expansion fund is not eligible to receive interest
20	buydown from the partnership in assisting community expansion fund for the same project
21	during the same biennium.
22	SECTION 26. A new subsection to section 54-17-07.3 of the North Dakota Century
23	Code is created and enacted as follows:
24	A program to assist in bridging the financing gap in new residential construction in
25	cities with populations of fewer than twenty thousand if the cost of the new
26	construction is at least one hundred ten percent of the appraised value of the new
27	construction. The program shall provide financial assistance in the form of a
28	mortgage loan that is subject to payment forgiveness, in whole or in part, for new
29	construction of multifamily housing and single-family housing, excluding mobile
30	homes and farmsteads.
