SB2069 would eliminate the \$400,000 biennial cap currently placed on the Civil Legal Services Fund. This bill will reduce revenue to the General Fund and increase revenue to the Civil Legal Service Fund.

Subsection 1 of section 27-05.2-03 caps the amount of revenue recored into the Civil Legal Services Fund at \$400,000. The \$400,000 cap has been met in each of the last three bienniums. The overages have been credited to the General Fund. Approximately \$79,000 in 03-05, \$117,500 in 05-07, and we anticipate over \$250,000 in 07-09.

From a review of prior history it appears fees collected "for filing a case for decision that is not a small claims action" have been experiencing an increasing trend over the last six years. We project that the fees collected will exceed the current \$400,000 cap. If the cap is removed the Civil Legal Services Fund is projected to increase by \$275,000 in 09-11 and \$325,000 in 11-13. The General Fund will decrease by this same amount.

The Civil Legal Service Fund is a continuing appropriation. An advisory committee consisting of the lieutenant governor, the director of the office of management and budget or the director's designee, and the state court administrator shall distribute moneys deposited in the indigent civil legal services fund.

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
