- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 50-11.1 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the establishment of <u>early childhood services inclusion support</u>
- 3 services and a grant program for licensed early childhood services providers who care for
- 4 children with special needs; to provide a continuing appropriation; and to provide an
- 5 appropriation.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

7 SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 50-11.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
8 and enacted as follows:

9	Early childhood services inclusion support services and grant program.			
10	1. The department shall establish an early childhood services inclusion grant program for			
11	licensed early childhood services providers that provide care for children with			
12	disabilities or developmental delays. The grant program must be designed to:			
13	a. Increase the number of staff in the adult-to-child ratio to expand supervision and			
14	the ability to care for children with disabilities or developmental delays; and			
15	<u>b.</u> Assist in modifying or adapting the early childhood services setting as needed to			
16	address the health and safety needs of children with disabilities or developmental			
17	delays.fund early childhood services specialists to make available technical			
18	assistance to early childhood services providers that care for children with special			
19	needs or developmental delays. The technical assistance program must be			
20	designed to:			
21	a. Assist early childhood services providers that request support and information			
22	regarding caring for children with special needs or developmental delays;			
23	b. Assist early childhood services providers in adapting the program environment			
24	and care practices to meet the individual child's needs and to build the early

7	receives support through either public or private services and includes a child who is in						
8	the process of being evaluated for public or private formal support. A child who is at						
9	risk for developmental delays includes any child between the ages of birth and twelve						
10	years who received foster care services; who has a previous substantiated history as						
11	a victim of child abuse, neglect, or domestic violence; who is homeless; who has						
12	documented special health care needs; or who has a parent with a significant						
13		lisability.					
14	6.	The department may accept gifts, grants, and donations from any source to assist the	_				
15	department in the establishment and implementation of the early childhood services						
16	inclusion support services and grant program. Any gifts, grants, and donations						
17	received are appropriated to the department on a continuing basis for the purpose of						
18	funding the early childhood services inclusion support services and grant program						
19		under this section.					
20	SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general						
21	fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$600,000, or so much of the-						
22	sum as may be necessary, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income-						
23	from the temporary assistance for needy families program, the sum of \$650,000, or so much of						
24	the sum as may be necessary, to the department of human services for the purpose of						
25	establishing an early childhood services provider inclusion grant program as provided for in-						
26	section 1 of this Act, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013. The						
27	funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated						
28	out of any moneys in the lands and minerals trust fund in the state treasury, not otherwise						
29	appropriated, to the department of human services for the purpose of funding the early						
30	childhood services inclusion support services and for establishing an early childhood services
