## **ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2298**

- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 50-11.1 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the establishment of early childhood services inclusion support
- 3 services and a grant program for licensed early childhood services providers who care for
- 4 children with special needs; to provide a continuing appropriation; and to provide an
- 5 appropriation.

## 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 7 SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 50-11.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
  8 and enacted as follows:
- 9 Early childhood services inclusion support services and grant program.
- <u>1.</u> <u>The department shall fund early childhood services specialists to make available</u>
   <u>technical assistance to early childhood services providers that care for children with</u>
   <u>special needs or developmental delays. The technical assistance program must be</u>
- 13 <u>designed to:</u>
- Assist early childhood services providers that request support and information
   regarding caring for children with special needs or developmental delays;
- 16b.Assist early childhood services providers in adapting the program environment17and care practices to meet the individual child's needs and to build the early18childhood services providers' capacity to serve children with special needs or19developmental delays;
- 20c.In partnership with the child's parents and health care provider, assist the early21childhood services provider in the development or coordination of care plans for22children with special needs or special health care needs relevant to the care23setting;

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1		<u>d.</u>	In partnership with the child's parents, foster communication with the team of	
2			specialists serving the child to ensure consistency in therapy practices and	
3			appropriate approaches;	
4		<u>e.</u>	Provide classroom training to early childhood services providers to assist the	
5			providers in the integration of children with special needs; and	
6		<u>f.</u>	As requested by the early childhood services providers, conduct one-on-one	
7			training at the provider's business to assist the provider in the integration of	
8			children with special needs.	
9	<u>2.</u>	<u>The</u>	e department shall establish a grant review committee to assist in the development	
10		<u>of g</u>	rant guidelines, the review of applications, and the determination of awards or	
11		<u>den</u>	ials. The membership of the grant review committee must include representation	
12		fror	n each of the following:	
13		<u>a.</u>	The department of human services;	
14		<u>b.</u>	The department of public instruction;	
15		<u>C.</u>	The North Dakota training and information center;	
16		<u>d.</u>	North Dakota child care resource and referral; and	
17		<u>e.</u>	Parents of children with disabilities or at risk for developmental delays.	
18	<u>3.</u>	To be eligible for the grant program, the early childhood services provider must:		
19		<u>a.</u>	Be state-licensed;	
20		<u>b.</u>	Submit a letter from the provider's county social services office confirming the	
21			provider's licensing status;	
22		<u>C.</u>	Submit a letter from a service provider that provides formal supports to the child	
23			confirming an increased funding need to assist the provider in serving the child	
24			with disabilities; and	
25		<u>d.</u>	Work with the child's family and an inclusion or health specialist to complete a	
26			care plan appropriate for the child care setting.	
27	<u>4.</u>	<u>The</u>	e department shall give priority consideration to licensed early childhood services	
28		pro	viders that care for children with disabilities.	
29	<u>5.</u>	<u>For</u>	purposes of this section, a child with disabilities or who is at risk for developmental	
30		<u>dela</u>	ays includes any child in this state between the ages of birth and twelve years who	
31		rece	eives support through either public or private services and includes a child who is in	

1		the process of being evaluated for public or private formal support. A c	<u>hild who is at</u>			
2		risk for developmental delays includes any child between the ages of b	oirth and twelve			
3		years who received foster care services; who has a previous substanti	ated history as			
4		a victim of child abuse, neglect, or domestic violence; who is homeless	s; who has			
5		documented special health care needs; or who has a parent with a sig	nificant			
6		disability.				
7	<u>6.</u>	The department may accept gifts, grants, and donations from any sour	ce to assist the			
8		department in the establishment and implementation of the early childle	nood services			
9		inclusion support services and grant program. Any gifts, grants, and do	onations			
10		received are appropriated to the department on a continuing basis for t	the purpose of			
11		funding the early childhood services inclusion support services and gra	ant program			
12		under this section.				
13	SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds					
14	as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the lands and minerals trust fund					
15	in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, to the department of human services for the					
16	purpose of funding the early childhood services inclusion support services and for establishing					
17	an early childhood services provider inclusion grant program as provided for in section 1 of this					
18	Act, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013, as follows:					
19	Early childhood services inclusion support \$450,000					
20	Early childhood services grant program <u>300,000</u>					
21	Total lands and minerals trust fund appropriation\$750,000
