## FIRST ENGROSSMENT with House Amendments ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2020

- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the state water
- 2 commission; to create and enact a new section to chapter 61-04 of the North Dakota Century
- 3 Code, relating to metering certain water sources; to amend and reenact section 7 of chapter 20
- 4 of the 2009 Session Laws, relating to Fargo flood control project funding; to provide
- 5 exemptions; to provide legislative intent; to provide for retroactive application; and to declare an
- 6 emergency.

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## 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

**SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the state water commission for the purpose of defraying the expenses of that agency, for the biennium beginning with the effective date of this Act, and ending June 30, 2013, as follows:

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## 1 SECTION 2. ONE-TIME FUNDING - EFFECT ON BASE BUDGET - REPORT TO 2 SIXTY-THIRD LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY. The following amounts reflect the one-time funding 3 items approved by the sixty-first legislative assembly for the 2009-11 biennium and the 2011-13 4 one-time funding items included in the appropriation in section 1 of this Act: 5 One-Time Funding Description 2011-13 <u>2009-11</u> 6 Federal stimulus funds \$12,000,000 \$7,271,773 7 Ray/Tioga, Burke/Divide/Williams, Wildrose 2,792,000 500,000 8 and Stanley water projects 9 Total special funds \$14,792,000 \$7,771,773 10 The 2011-13 one-time funding amounts are not part of the entity's base budget for the 2013-15 11 biennium. The state water commission shall report to the appropriations committees of the 12 sixty-third legislative assembly on the use of the one-time funding for the biennium beginning 13 July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013. 14 SECTION 3. SOVEREIGN LANDS ENFORCEMENT GRANT. The administrative and 15 support services line item in section 1 of this Act includes \$200,000 from the general fund that 16 the state water commission shall provide as a grant to the game and fish department for law 17 enforcement activities on sovereign lands in the state, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, 18 and ending June 30, 2013. 19 SECTION 4. ADDITIONAL INCOME - APPROPRIATION. In addition to the amounts 20 included in the estimated income line item in section 1 of this Act, any additional amounts in the 21 resources trust fund and water development trust fund that become available are appropriated 22 to the state water commission for the purpose of defraying the expenses of that agency, for the 23 biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and ending June 30, 2013. 24 SECTION 5. GRANTS - WATER-RELATED PROJECTS - CARRYOVER AUTHORITY. 25 Section 54-44.1-11 does not apply to funding for grants or water-related projects included in the 26 water and atmospheric resources line item in section 1 of this Act. However, this exclusion is 27 only in effect for two years after June 30, 2013. Any unexpended funds appropriated from the 28 resources trust fund after that period has expired must be transferred to the resources trust fund 29 and any unexpended funds appropriated from the water development trust fund after that period 30 has expired must be transferred to the water development trust fund.

1	<b>SECTION 6.</b> A new section to chapter 61-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is created				
2	and enacted as follows:				
3	Metering of certain water sources required - Rules.				
4	The state engineer shall require the remote metering of water used pursuant to a temporary				
5	or perfected water permit and sold for oil and gas purposes. Except for nonpotable ground				
6	water used for enhanced oil recovery purposes and water uses of less than fifteen acre-feet per				
7	year, all other permitted and temporarily permitted industrial water supplies sold for oil and gas				
8	purposes are subject to the metering requirements of this section. The state engineer shall				
9	develop rules to provide:				
10	<u>1.</u>	The specifications for remote terminal water metering devices;			
11	<u>2.</u>	That metering be operational by July 1, 2012;			
12	<u>3.</u>	That meters be available for inspection by state water commission staff on a daily			
13		basis;			
14	<u>4.</u>	That meters be sealed and tamperproof;			
15	<u>5.</u>	That meters may be replaced only under supervision of the state engineer; and			
16	<u>6.</u>	That the penalty for circumventing the provisions of this section shall be a thirty-day			
17		suspension of the noncompliant permit.			
18	SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 7 of chapter 20 of the 2009 Session Laws is amended				
19	9 and reenacted as follows:				
20	SECTION 7. FARGO FLOOD CONTROL PROJECT FUNDING - EXEMPTION.				
21		Of the funds appropriated in the water and atmospheric resources line item in			
22		section 1 of this Act, \$45,000,000 is for Fargo flood control projects, for the biennium			
23		beginning July 1, 2009, and ending June 30, 2011. Any funds not spent by June 30,			
24		2011, are not subject to section 54-44.1-11 and must be continued into the next or			
25		subsequent bienniums and may be expended only for Fargo flood control projects.			
26		TheseExcept as otherwise provided, these funds may be used only for land purchases-			
27		and construction; including right-of-way acquisition costs. No more than ten percent of			
28		these funds may not be used for administration, engineering, legal, planning, or other			
29		similar purposes; and are not subject to the sixty-five percent funding requirement			
RΛ		contained in Senate Bill No. 2316 (2000). The city of Fargo, Cass County, and the			

1 Cass County joint water resource district must approve any expenditures made under 2 this section. 3 SECTION 8. FARGO FLOOD CONTROL PROJECT FUNDING - EXEMPTION. Of the 4 funds appropriated in the water and atmospheric resources line item in section 1 of this Act, 5 \$30,000,000 is for Fargo flood control projects, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2011, and 6 ending June 30, 2013. Any funds not spent by June 30, 2013, are not subject to section 7 54-44.1-11 and must be continued into the next or subsequent bienniums and may be 8 expended only for Fargo flood control projects. Except as otherwise provided, these funds may 9 be used only for construction, including right-of-way acquisition costs. No more than ten percent of these funds may be used for engineering, legal, planning, or other similar purposes. The city 10 11 of Fargo, Cass County, and the Cass County joint water resource district must approve any 12 expenditures made under this section. 13 SECTION 9. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - STATE WATER COMMISSION PROJECTS AND 14 GRANTS. It is the intent of the sixty-second legislative assembly that of the funds appropriated 15 in the water and atmospheric resources line item in section 1 of this Act, the state water 16 commission provide funding for the following grants and projects, for the biennium beginning 17 with the effective date of this Act, and ending June 30, 2013: 18 Grant to wildlife services for animal control \$100,000 19 Flood-related water projects in the \$250,000 20 Nelson County water resource district 21 SECTION 10. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - WATER-RELATED FUNDING PRIORITIES. It is 22 the intent of the sixty-second legislative assembly that the \$5,000,000 for the Red River valley 23 water supply project identified by the state water commission as a 2011-13 biennium funding 24 priority be used for general statewide water management and that the state water commission 25 not spend any funding for the Red River valley water supply project during the 2011-13 26 biennium. 27 SECTION 11. RETROACTIVE APPLICATION. Section 7 of this Act applies retroactively to 28 January 1, 2011. 29 **SECTION 12. EMERGENCY.** This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
