- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15.1-09-58 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to early childhood education; and to provide an appropriation for early childhood
- 3 education grants.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-09-58 of the North Dakota Century Code is

6 amended and reenacted as follows:

7 15.1-09-58. Prekindergarten programEarly childhood education - Authorization -

8 Support.

9 The board of a school district may establish a prekindergartenan early childhood education

10 program and may receive and expend any statesupport that program with:

11 <u>1.</u> Local tax revenues, other than those necessary to support the district's kindergarten

12 program and the provision of elementary and high school educational services;

13 <u>2.</u> <u>State</u> moneys specifically appropriated for the program, any federal;

14 <u>3.</u> <u>Federal</u> funds specifically appropriated or approved for the program, and any gifts; and

15 <u>4.</u> <u>Gifts</u>, grants, and donations specifically given for the program.

16 SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general

17 fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$4,683,000, or so much of the

- 18 sum as may be necessary, to the superintendent of public instruction for the purpose of
- 19 providing annual early childhood education grants to eligible school districts, for the biennium
- 20 beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015.
- Any school district offering a program of early childhood education, approved in
 accordance with section 15.1-37-01, is eligible to receive a grant under this section.
- 2. The superintendent of public instruction shall provide for an annual application process
 and shall select award recipients. The selection process must take into account the

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- geographic distribution of recipients, the district's service area, the general economic
 circumstances within the service area, and the district's current or anticipated financial
 commitment to providing early childhood education.
- 4 3. A school district may not receive more than \$100,000 annually under this section.
- 4. As a condition of receiving an early childhood education grant, a school district shall
 commit to maintaining a full-time equivalent student-teacher ratio of ten-to-one or
 sixteen-to-one if the teacher is assisted by a full-time classroom aid.
- 8 5. As a condition of receiving an early childhood education grant, a school district shall
 9 commit to utilizing the PowerSchool information system and to providing data to the
 10 superintendent of public instruction at the time and in the manner requested by the
 11 superintendent.
- The superintendent of public instruction shall monitor the grant recipients, compile
 data regarding the recipients' provision of early childhood education, and report any
 findings and recommendations to the legislative management.

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
