1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the agriculture

2 commissioner; to create and enact a new section to chapter 19-13.1 of the North Dakota

3 Century Code, relating to license, inspection, and registration fees; to amend and reenact

4 section 4-01-21 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the salary of the agriculture

5 commissioner; to provide for transfers; to provide for a legislative management study of the milk

6 marketing board; and to provide an exemption.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8 **SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds 9 as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state 10 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and 11 other income, to the agriculture commissioner for the purpose of defraying the expenses of that 12 agency, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015, as follows:

21 The 2013-15 one-time funding amounts are not a part of the entity's base budget for the

22 2015-17 biennium. The agriculture commissioner shall report to the appropriations committees

- 23 of the sixty-fourth legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium
- beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015.

25 SECTION 3. TRANSFER - ENVIRONMENT AND RANGELAND PROTECTION FUND -

26 MINOR USE PESTICIDE FUND. The agriculture commissioner shall transfer \$325,000 from the

- 27 environment and rangeland protection fund to the minor use pesticide fund during the biennium
- 28 beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015.

29 SECTION 4. ESTIMATED INCOME - ENVIRONMENT AND RANGELAND PROTECTION

- 30 **FUND.** The estimated income line item in section 1 of this Act includes the sum of
- 31 \$5,997,408\$6,122,681, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, from the environment and

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1	rangeland protection fund for the purpose of defraying the expenses of various department of
2	agriculture programs, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015.
3	SECTION 5. ESTIMATED INCOME - GAME AND FISH FUND. The estimated income line
4	item in section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$484,398, or so much of the sum as may be
5	necessary, from the game and fish department operating fund for the purpose of defraying the
6	expenses of various agriculture department of agriculture programs, for the biennium beginning
7	July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015.
8	SECTION 6. ESTIMATED INCOME - STATE WATER COMMISSION - TRANSFER. The
9	estimated income line item in section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$250,000 which the state
10	water commission shall transfer to the agriculture commissioner for the wildlife services
11	program, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015.
12	SECTION 7. EXEMPTION - JOHNE'S DISEASE CONTROL. The amount appropriated for
13	Johne's disease control in section 1 of chapter 35 of the 2011 Session Laws is not subject to
14	section 54-44.1-11 and any unexpended appropriations may be continued into the biennium
15	beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015.
16	SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 4-01-21 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended
17	and reenacted as follows:

20	eightfour hundred twenty-sixseventy-eight dollars through June 30, 20122014, and
21	ninety-fiveone hundred one thousand sixfour hundred tenthirty-two dollars thereafter.
22	SECTION 8. DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE OFFICE LEASE - TERMINATION. The
23	agriculture commissioner shall terminate any lease of office space off of the capitol grounds if
24	sufficient office space on the capitol grounds is provided to the department of agriculture by the
25	office of management and budget for the biennium beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30,
26	2015.
27	SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 4-01-21 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended
28	and reenacted as follows:
29	4-01-21. Salary of agriculture commissioner.
30	The annual salary of the agriculture commissioner is ninety-two thousand eight hundred
31	twenty-sixninety-nine thousand four hundred thirty-five dollars through June 30, 20122014, and

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1 ninety-five thousand six hundred tenone hundred three thousand four hundred twelve dollars

- 2 thereafter.
- 3 SECTION 10. A new section to chapter 19-13.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 4 created and enacted as follows:
- 5 **Deposit of fees.**

6 <u>The commissioner shall forward all inspection fees, license fees, and registration fees</u>

- 7 received under this chapter to the state treasurer. The state treasurer shall deposit the first-
- 8 <u>\$485,000 of fees received under this chapter each biennium in the environment and rangeland</u>
- 9 protection fund-and any remaining fees in the general fund.

10 SECTION 11. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - MILK MARKETING BOARD.

11 During the 2013-14 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying the structure of 12 the milk marketing board; its statutory duties; the manner in which it prescribes and regulates 13 producer, distributor, and retail prices throughout the state; and the manner in which it 14 investigates and resolves concerns regarding the price and availability of milk throughout the 15 state. If conducted, the study must review any policy or regulatory changes that the board has 16 implemented in order to address pricing issues and availability of milk in the western portion of 17 this state. The study must examine whether the continued regulation of the grade A dairy 18 industry is best accomplished by the milk marketing board in its current form and operating 19 under its current statutory directives, whether changes are needed to the board or its statutory 20 directives, and whether there are other methods by which the desired results could be 21 effectively and efficiently achieved. The legislative management shall report its findings and 22 recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to 23 the sixty-fourth legislative assembly.
