8	SECTION 1. A new subsection to section 61-28-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
9	created and enacted as follows:			
0	"Septage" means the liquid or solid material removed from septic systems, cesspools,			
11	privies, chemical toilets, holding tanks, and similar devices that receive domestic			
2	wastewater.			
3	SECTION 2. A new subsection to section 61-28-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
4	created and enacted as follows:			
5	"Septic system" means a disposal system, and all of its components, used to receive,			
6	treat, and dispose of domestic wastewater through microbiological decomposition and			
7	soil absorption.			
8	SECTION 3. A new subsection to section 61-28-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
9	created and enacted as follows:			
20	"Septic system servicer" means a person that engages in the business of servicing			
21	septic systems, cesspools, privies, chemical toilets, holding tanks, and similar devices			
22	that receive domestic wastewater.

7	<u>Sep</u>	Septic system servicing - Permit required - Inspection authority - Fees.			
8	<u>1.</u>	A person engaging in the business of servicing septic systems must have a permit			
9		issued by the department and must comply with the conditions imposed by the permit.			
10	<u>2.</u>	The department shall administer and enforce a permitting program for septic system			
11		servic	ers and has the following powers and duties:		
12		<u>a.</u> <u>T</u>	o require training of and to examine septic system servicers and their		
13		<u>e</u>	employees;		
14		<u>b.</u> <u>T</u>	o establish standards and procedures for permitting of septic system servicers;		
15		<u>c.</u> <u>T</u>	o issue permits to all applicants who satisfy the requirements for certification		
16		<u>U</u>	under this section and any rules under this section, to renew permits, and to		
17		<u>s</u>	suspend or revoke permits for cause after notice and opportunity for hearing;		
18		<u>d.</u> <u>T</u>	o establish reasonable fees for permitting septic system servicers;		
19		<u>e.</u> <u>I</u>	o establish criteria for the sanitary management of septage, including standards		
20		<u>f</u>	or the transportation, treatment, and disposal of septage;		
21		<u>f.</u> <u>I</u>	o require preapproval of land application sites;		
22		<u>g.</u> <u>I</u>	o require recordkeeping and reporting;		
23		<u>h.</u> <u>I</u>	o require spill reporting, corrective action, and evidence of financial

- Any person who violates this chapter, or any permit condition, rule, order, limitation, or
  other applicable requirement implementing this chapter, is subject to a civil penalty not
  to exceed <u>fivetwelve</u> thousand <u>five hundred</u> dollars per day per violation.
