1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact chapter 16.1-03.1 of the North Dakota Century Code,

2 relating to political party committee organizations; to amend and reenact sections

3 16.1-06-04, 16.1-11-22, 16.1-11-30, and 16.1-12-02 of the North Dakota Century Code,

4 relating to primary election ballot access and eligibility for minor political parties; and to

5 repeal chapter 16.1-03 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to political party

6 committee organization.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8 **SECTION 1.** Chapter 16.1-03.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted

9 as follows:

10 <u>16.1-03.1-01. Organizations allowed to nominate statewide and legislative candidates.</u>

11 <u>A political organization may not endorse candidates or have candidates petition for</u>

12 president, vice president, Congress, statewide office, or legislative office as set forth in

- 13 <u>chapter 16.1-11, unless the organization:</u>
- 14 <u>1.</u> <u>Had printed on the ballot at the last preceding general election the names of a set of</u>
- 15 presidential electors pledged to the election of the party's candidate for president and
- 16 <u>vice president, a candidate for governor, a candidate for attorney general, or a</u>
- 17 <u>candidate for secretary of state and those candidates for presidential electors,</u>
- 18 governor, attorney general, or secretary of state received at least five percent of the
- 19 total vote cast for presidential electors, the office of governor, attorney general, or
- 20 secretary of state within this state at that election; and
- 2. Organized according to the requirements of bylaws the organization has filed with the
 secretary of state; or
- 23 <u>3.</u> Filed a petition with the secretary of state as set forth in section 16.1-11-30.

1 16.1-03.1-02. Minimum requirements of bylaws. 2 Bylaws filed with the secretary of state of a political organization seeking to be recognized 3 under this chapter must include the following minimum provisions relating to: 4 Election and removal of officers; 1. 5 <u>2.</u> Filling vacancies; 6 3. Annual meeting requirements, notices, and procedures; 7 Procedures for amending bylaws; 4. 8 <u>5.</u> Membership requirements, if any; and 9 Requiring organization of the party in at least a majority of the legislative districts. 6. 10 Upon submission of the bylaws of the political organization and proof, if requested by the 11 secretary of state, of organizational structure within the minimum number of legislative districts 12 according to the provisions of this chapter, the secretary of state shall issue a certificate of 13 recognition to the political organization. 14 Failure to provide proof of organization in at least a majority of the legislative districts shall 15 result in the loss of recognized status. 16 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-06-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is 17 amended and reenacted as follows: 18 16.1-06-04. Form and quality of ballots generally. 19 All official ballots prepared under this title must: 20 1. Be printed on uniform quality and color of paper in an ink color suitable to make the 21 ballot clearly legible and compatible with the electronic voting system requirements 22 necessary to tabulate the votes. 23 Be of sufficient length to contain the names of all candidates to be voted for at that 2. 24 election. 25 Have the language "Vote for no more than _____ name (or names)" placed 3. 26 immediately under the name of each office. 27 4. Have printed thereon "To vote for the candidate of your choice, you must darken the 28 oval oppositenext to the name of thethat candidate. To vote for a person whose name 29 is not printed on the ballot, you must darken the oval next to the blank line provided 30 and write that person's name inon the blank space provided for that purpose and 31 darken the oval opposite the space providedline."

3	3 At the primary election there may be only one ballot for all parties or principles. The ballot		
4	4 must be in the following form:		
5	1.	The ballot must be entitled the "consolidated primary election ballot".	
6	2.	Each political party or principle having candidates at the primary election must have a	
7		separate columnsection on the ballot.	
8	3.	At the head of each column must be printed the name of the political party or principle

20		party must be printed: "To vote for the candidate of your choice, you must darken the

22		is not printed on the ballot, you must darken the oval next to the blank line provided	
23		and write that person's name inon the blank space provided for that purpose and	
24		darken the oval opposite the space providedline."	
25	6.	The offices specified in section 16.1-11-26 must be arranged in each columnsection	
26		with the name of each office in the center of each political party columnsection at the	
27		head of the names of all the aspirants for the office.	
28	7.	Immediately under the name of each office must be printed: "Vote for no more than	
29		name (or names)."	

8. Immediately preceding and on the same line as the name of each aspirant must be
 printed an oval in which the voter is to mark the voter's choice by darkening the oval
 next to the name of the candidate chosen.

9. The political party or principle which cast the largest vote for governor at the most
recent primary election at which the office of governor was voted upon must have the
left-hand columnfirst section, and the political party or principle casting the next largest
vote must have the next columnsecond section, and so on.

8 The judges and the inspector of elections shall inform each elector at the primary, before voting,

9 that if the voter votes for candidates of more than one political party the voter's political party

10 ballot will be rejected.

SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-11-30 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

13 16.1-11-30. Separate columnsection on primary election ballot required for each
political party.

15 Any party that had printed on the ballot at the last preceding presidential election the names 16 of a set of presidential electors pledged to the election of the party's candidates for president 17 and vice president or a candidate for governor and those candidates for presidential electors or 18 governor received at least five percent of the total vote cast for presidential electors or the office 19 of governor within this state at that election; any party that had printed on the ballot at the last 20 preceding nonpresidential election a candidate for attorney general or secretary of state, and 21 the candidate received at least five percent of the total vote cast for the office the candidate was 22 seeking at the election; or any party that has organized according to all the requirements of 23 chapter 16.1-03 must be provided with a separate columnsection on primary election ballots. 24 Any other political organization is entitled to endorse candidates or have candidates petition 25 to be included on the primary ballot in a consolidated column or on a special separate section of 26 the consolidated primary election ballot, if a petition signed by at least seven thousand qualified 27 electors of this state is filed with the secretary of state before four p.m. of the sixtieth day before 28 a primary or special election, naming the political organization, stating the platform principles of 29 the party, and requesting the names of its candidates to be included on the state's primary ballot 30 in a consolidated column. If separate section. Political organizations that are granted ballot 31 access under this section are allowed ballot access only for those offices for which the

1 organization has identified candidates. Regardless of the means by which the petition is mailed, 2 it<u>delivered</u>, the original must be in the possession of the secretary of state before four p.m. on 3 the sixtieth day prior to a primary or special election. Candidates of that party are entitled to the 4 same rights and privileges as those of other parties. Petitions circulated according to this 5 section must be filed with the secretary of state in accordance with section 1-01-50. 6 A political organization that had printed on the ballot at the last preceding presidential 7 election the names of a set of presidential electors pledged to the election of the party's 8 candidates for president and vice president or a candidate for governor and those candidates 9 for presidential electors or governor received at least five percent of the total vote cast for 10 presidential electors or the office of governor within this state at that election, and any political 11 organization that has printed on the ballot at the last preceding nonpresidential election a 12 candidate for attorney general or secretary of state, and the candidate received at least five 13 percent of the total vote cast for the office the candidate was seeking at the election are entitled 14 to organize according to the requirements of chapter 16.1-0316.1-03.1. 15 SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-12-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is

16 amended and reenacted as follows:

17 **16.1-12-02.** Certificates of nomination by petition - Form and contents.

18 Certificates of nomination for nominees for an office to be filled at a general or special 19 election, except for an office appearing on the no-party ballot, may be made as provided by this 20 section. Except for nominees for president of the United States, names of nominees so 21 nominated must appear on the ballot as independent nominations. The names of nominees for 22 president of the United States may appear on the ballot with a designation, not to exceed five 23 words, that names the organization or political party to which the presidential candidate 24 affiliates. The designation may not falsely indicate an affiliation with or the support of any 25 political party organized in accordance with this title or include any substantive word or phrase 26 that is profane or that is already included in or resembles the name of a political party entitled to 27 a separate column under section 16.1-11-30. Except for candidates for the office of president of 28 the United States, each certificate of nomination by petition must meet the specifications for 29 nominating petitions set forth in section 16.1-11-16. A political party or organization desiring to 30 submit to the secretary of state the name of a qualified candidate for the office of the president 31 of the United States may begin gathering the signatures for the certificate of nomination on the

1 first day of January of a presidential election year and shall submit the petition to the secretary 2 of state before four p.m. on the sixtieth day before the general election. The signatures on the 3 petition must be in the following number: 4 Except as provided in subsection 3, if the nomination is for an office to be filled by the 1. 5 qualified electors of the entire state, there must be no fewer than one thousand 6 signatures. 7 2. If the nomination is for an office to be filled by the gualified electors of a district less 8 than the entire state, the number of signatures must be at least two percent of the 9 resident population of the district as determined by the most recent federal decennial 10 census, but in no case may more than three hundred signatures be required. 11 If the nomination is for the office of president, there must be no fewer than four 3. 12 thousand signatures and the petition must contain the names of the presidential and 13 vice presidential candidates along with the names of the North Dakota presidential

- 14 <u>electors selected from the qualified electors of North Dakota</u>.
- 15 4. If the petition is for the office of governor or lieutenant governor, it must contain the
 16 names and other required information of candidates for both those offices.
- 17 **SECTION 6. REPEAL.** Chapter 16.1-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is repealed.
