SIXTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

SPEAKER DEVLIN DEEMED approval of the amendments to HCR 3006, HCR 3037, HCR 3044, SB 2047, Engrossed SB 2106, Reengrossed SB 2223, SB 2266, SB 2337, and Reengrossed SB 2339.

SCR 4013: A concurrent resolution supporting the second United States Navy ship to carry the name of our Great State - USS NORTH DAKOTA (SSN-784).

4. For any week with respect to which it is found that the individual's unemployment is due to any kind of labor dispute, including a strike, sympathy strike, or a claimant's work stoppage dispute of any kind which exists because of a labor dispute at the factory, establishment, or other premises at which the individual is or was last employed~~lockout~~; provided, that this subsection does not apply if it is shown that:
 - a. The individual is not participating in or directly interested in the labor dispute ~~which caused the strike, sympathy strike, or a claimant's work stoppage dispute of any kind~~; and
 - b. The individual does not belong to a grade or class of workers of which, immediately before the commencement of the ~~stoppage~~labor dispute, there were members employed at the premises at which the ~~strike, sympathy strike, or a claimant's work stoppage~~labor dispute of any kind occurs, any of whom are participating in or directly interested in the labor dispute; provided, that if in any case separate branches of work, which are commonly conducted as separate businesses in separate premises, are conducted in separate departments of the same premises, each such department must, for the purpose of this subsection, be deemed to be a separate factory, establishment, or other premises.

SECTION 3. EMERGENCY. Section 2 of this Act is declared to be an emergency measure."
