## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - RECORD OF NORTH DAKOTA VETERANS. During the 2013-14 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying the feasibility and desirability of creating a record of all North Dakota veterans since the Vietnam War and a record of all North Dakotans killed in action since statehood. The study may include consideration of what types of personal and military information may be appropriate to include in the record, the projected cost of creating this record, which entity would be responsible for creating and maintaining the record, and the appropriate format for the compiled information. The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-fourth legislative assembly."
