BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 27-06-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

27-06-06. Transcript in criminal action prepared at expense of state - Filing and use of transcript.

A judge of a district court in which a criminal action or proceeding has been tried, on that judge's own motion or on application of the defendant or the state's attorney of the county, may order a transcript of the original shorthand notes of the action or proceeding, or of any part thereof, to be made by the reporter at state expense whenever there is reasonable cause therefor. The transcript, when prepared, must consist of one copy to be filed in the office of the clerk of court, one copy for each party separately represented, and, if the defendant is sentenced to the

legal and physical custody of, or placed under the supervision and management of, the department of corrections and rehabilitation, one copy to the department. The court reporter shall-individual preparing the transcript is entitled to receive compensation for preparation of the transcript in accordance with the provisions of section 27-06-08 rules and policies adopted by the supreme court.

SECTION 2. REPEAL. Section 27-06-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is repealed."
