1 A BILL for an Act to provide appropriations to the department of human services for improving

2 behavioral health services and for substance abuse treatment services; to provide an

3 appropriation to the department of public instruction for teacher and noncertified school staff

4 trainingto provide for reports to the legislative management; and to provide for legislative

5 management studies.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

7 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES - YOUTH

8 **MENTAL HEALTH ASSESSMENT NETWORK.** There is appropriated out of any moneys in the 9 general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$1,500,000, or so 10 much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of human services to begin to 11 develop a youth mental health assessment network, for the period beginning July 1, 2016, and 12 ending June 30, 2017. The department of human services shall develop requirements for a 13 youth mental health assessment network and shall ensure that entities accepting funding as 14 part of the youth mental health assessment network developed under this section report 15 process and outcome measures.

16 SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES - PILOT

17 **PROJECT - DISCHARGE PLANNING PROTOCOLS.** There is appropriated out of any moneys 18 in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$175,000, or so 19 much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of human services for the purpose of 20 establishing a pilot project involving law enforcement, health care providers, and other related 21 organizations in one region to develop planning protocols for discharge or release of individuals 22 with behavioral health issues, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 23 2017. The protocols must include outcome measures. The requirements of chapter 54-44.4 do 24 not apply to the selection of a grantee, the grant award, or payments made under this section.

1 **SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES - BEHAVIORAL** 2 **HEALTH FTE.** There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state 3 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$166,092, or so much of the sum as may be 4 necessary, to the department of human services for the purpose of hiring one full-time 5 equivalent employee to facilitate the behavioral health activities required of the department of 6 human services found in Senate Bill Nos. 2045 and 2046, and sections 1 and 2 of this Act, for 7 the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017. 8 -SECTION 5. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION - TRAINING. 9 There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise-10 appropriated, the sum of \$250,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the 11 department of public instruction for the purpose of providing grants to regional education-12 associations for mental health first-aid training for teachers and noncertified school staff, for the-13 biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017. The department shall establish 14 guidelines to gualify for a grant under this section which must include a matching requirement 15 one dollar of matching funds for every one dollar of grant funds. Schools which do not belong to 16 a regional education association may apply to a regional education association for grant-17 funding, but must supply the required matching funds to the association. 18 SECTION 4. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES - REPORTS TO 19 THE LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general 20 fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$2,000,000, or so much of the 21 sum as may be necessary, to the department of human services for the purpose of addressing 22 gaps in the state's substance abuse treatment system, including intervention, detoxification, and 23 recovery services, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017. The 24 department of human services shall ensure recipients of funding under this section collect and 25 report process and outcome measures. Recipients of funding under this section shall implement 26 research-based programs. The department of human services shall require recipients of funding 27 under this section to develop sustainability plans and participate in training and technical 28 assistance. The department of human services shall report to the legislative management on 29 the use of these funds by July 1, 2016. 30 SECTION 5. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - ADULT MENTAL HEALTH 31 ASSESSMENT NETWORK. During the 2015-16 interim, the legislative management shall

1 consider studying mental health assessment network for adults. The study must identify the
2 populations that may benefit from an adult mental health assessment network, the challenges
3 and any deficiencies that may exist, alternative assessment delivery frameworks, and provide
4 details of how assessment networks may be integrated into the existing mental health delivery
5 system. The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, along with
6 any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-fifth legislative
7 assembly.

8 SECTION 6. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - MENTAL HEALTH SCREENING 9 AND ASSESSMENT FOR CHILDREN. During the 2015-16 interim, the legislative management 10 shall consider studying mental health screening and assessment programs for children. If 11 conducted, the study must identify a potential standardized screening process using evidence-12 based practices to routinely screen all children ages two through four at primary health care 13 sites. The study must also review the feasibility and desirability of implementing a visiting 14 nurses program for children ages zero through five. The legislative management shall report its 15 findings and recommendations, along with any legislation required to implement the 16 recommendations, to the sixty-fifth legislative assembly.

17 SECTION 7. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - BEHAVIORAL HEALTH NEEDS OF 18 **YOUTH AND ADULTS.** During the 2015-16 interim, the legislative management shall consider 19 studying behavioral health needs. The study must include consideration of behavioral health 20 needs of youth and adults and access, availability, and delivery of services. The study must 21 include input from stakeholders, including representatives of law enforcement, social and 22 clinical service providers, education, medical providers, mental health advocacy organizations, 23 emergency medical service providers, juvenile court, tribal government, and state and local 24 agencies and institutions. The study must also include consideration of developing a grant 25 program for mental health first-aid training for teachers and noncertified school staff and 26 monitoring and reviewing the strategies to improve behavioral health services implemented 27 pursuant to legislation enacted by the sixty-fourth legislative assembly and other behavioral 28 health-related recommendations presented to the 2013-14 interim human services committee. 29 The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, along with any

30 legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-fifth legislative assembly.
