- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 16.1-01-04, 16.1-05-07, and 16.1-07-06 of the
- 2 North Dakota Century Code, relating to voting requirements, qualifications of electors, and voter
- 3 identification.

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4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-01-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is

6 amended and reenacted as follows:

16.1-01-04. Qualifications of electors - Voting requirements.

- Every citizen of the United States who is eighteen years or older; a resident of this
 state; and has resided in the precinct at least thirty days next preceding any election,
 except as otherwise provided in regard to residency in chapter 16.1-14, is a qualified
 elector.
- For the purposes of this title, every qualified elector may have only one residence,
 shown by an actual fixed permanent dwelling, establishment, or any other abode.
- Except as otherwise provided in this section, an individual's residence must be
 determined in accordance with the rules for determining residency as provided in
 section 54-01-26.
- Pursuant to section 2 of article II of the Constitution of North Dakota, voting by
 individuals convicted and sentenced for a felony must be limited according to chapter
 12.1-33.
- 5. For the purposes of this title, an individual may not be deemed to have gained or lost a residence solely by reason of the individual's presence or absence while enrolled as a student at a college, university, or other postsecondary institution of learning in this state.

8	8.	For	purposes of this title, a qualified elector may not authorize an attorney in fact,			
9		gua	rdian, or other individual to apply for any ballot or to vote in any election on behalf			
10		of o	r in the place of the qualified elector.			
11	<u>9.</u>	<u>For</u>	purposes of this title, an elector seeking to vote in an election must meet the			
12		<u>ider</u>	ntification requirements specified in sections 16.1-05-07 and 16.1-07-06.			
13	SEC	CTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-05-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
14	amended and reenacted as follows:					
15	16.1	-05-0	07. Poll clerks to check identification and verify eligibility - Poll clerks to			
16	request, correct, and update incorrect information contained in the pollbook.					
17	1.	Bef	ore delivering a ballot to an individual according to section 16.1-13-22, the poll			
18		clerks shall require the individual to show identification, which includes the individual's				
19		residential address and date of birth. The valid forms of identification may include are:				
20		a.	A current driver's license or nondriver identification card issued by the department			
21			of transportation or other official form of identification issued by the state;			
22		b.	An official form of identification issued by a tribal government;			
23		C.	An alternative form of identificationA long-term care certificate prescribed by the			
24			secretary of state, if the individual does not possess an official form of			
25			identification provided for under subdivision a or b; or			
26		d.	A combination of any of the forms of identification under subdivisions a through			
27			eFor a uniformed service member or a qualifying family member temporarily			
28			stationed away from the individual's residence in the state or a qualified elector			
29			temporarily living outside the country, a current military identification card or			
30			passport if the individual does not possess an official form of identification			
31			provided for under subdivision a or b.			

1	2.	a.	When verifying an individual's eligibility or when entering the name of an			
2			individual into the pollbook, poll clerks shall request, correct, and update any			
3			incorrect or incomplete information about an individual required to be included in			
4			the pollbook generated from the central voter file.			
5		b.	If the individual's name is contained in the pollbook generated from the central			
6			voter file, the poll clerks shall verify the individual's residential address and			
7			mailing address, if different from the individual's residential address.			
8		C.	If the individual's name is not contained in the pollbook generated from the			
9			central voter file but the individual is determined eligible to vote, the poll clerks			
10			shall record the individual's name in the pollbook. The poll clerks shall request			
11			and obtain any additional information for the individual required to be included in			
12			the pollbook.			
13	3.	Poll	clerks shall direct an individual who is attempting to vote in the incorrect precinct			
14		<u>or v</u>	vho does not meet the thirty-day residency requirement to the proper precinct and			
15		voti	ng location.			
16	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-07-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is					
17	7 amended and reenacted as follows:					
18	3 16.1-07-06. Application form.					
19	1.	Арр	plication for an absent voter's ballot must be made on a form, prescribed by the			
20		sec	retary of state, to be furnished by the proper officer of the county, city, or school			
21		dist	rict in which the applicant is an elector, on any form, approved by the secretary of			
22		stat	e, or any blank containing the following:			
23		a.	The applicant's name.			
24		b.	The applicant's current or most recent North Dakota residential address.			
25		C.	The applicant's mailing address.			
26		d.	The applicant's current contact telephone number.			
27		e.	The election for which the ballot is being requested.			
28		f.	The date of the request.			
29		g.	An affirmation that the applicant has resided, or will reside, in the precinct for at			
30			least thirty days next preceding the election and will be a qualified elector of the			
31			precinct.			

1		h. The applicant's signature.
2		i. A space for the voter to indicate the voter's status as a citizen living outside the
3		United States, a uniformed service member living away from the voter's North
4		Dakota residence, or a family member of the uniformed service member living
5		away from the voter's North Dakota residence.
6		j. The applicant's birth date and year.
7		k. The applicant's motor vehicle operator's license or nondriver identification-
8		number or tribalAs provided in subsection 1 of section 16.1-05-07, the
9		identification number from one of the applicant's valid forms of identification or a
10		copy of the voter's alternate form of identification approved by the secretary of
11		state under subdivision c of subsection 1 of section 16.1-05-07 applicant's
12		long-term care certificate.
13	2.	If the applicant is unable to sign the applicant's name to the application, the applicant
14		shall mark (X) or use the applicant's signature stamp on the application in the
15		presence of a disinterested individual. The disinterested individual shall print the name
16		of the individual marking the X or using the signature stamp below the X or signature
17		stamp and shall sign the disinterested individual's own name following the printed
18		name together with the notation "witness to the mark".
19	3.	If the applicant does not possess or cannot secure an approved form of identification
20		as provided for under subsection 1 of section 16.1-05-07 due to a disability with which
21		the individual lives and which prevents the individual from traveling to obtain, the
22		application also must be signed by another qualified elector who, by signing, certifies
23		that the applicant is a qualified elector. The secretary of state shall prescribe the form
24		of the certification required under this subsection. An individual may not certify the
25		qualifications of more than four applicants in an election.
26	4.	The application for a qualified elector serving on active duty as a uniformed service
27		member or a family member who is a qualified elector and stationed at a location other
28		than that individual's voting residential address must include the following additional
29		information if the voter desires to vote by facsimile or electronic mail:
30		a. Facsimile telephone number; or
31		b. Electronic mail address.

- 1 5. The application for a qualified elector living outside the United States must include a
- facsimile telephone number or electronic mail address if the voter desires to vote by
 facsimile or electronic mail.
- 4 6. Except for the applicant's date of birth and motor vehicle driver's license or nondriver
- 5 identification card number, the application is an open record under section 44-04-18.
