1 A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Management to study the identification of

2 properly trained assistance dogs providing legitimate service to their owners, waivers of local

3 registration fees, and the effect of various local ordinances on the acquisition and use of

4 assistance dogs.

5 WHEREAS, assistance dogs are specially trained to provide specific services to their

6 handlers; and

7 **WHEREAS**, assistance dogs provide to their owners the opportunity to fully participate in

8 social, educational, and occupational settings, thereby greatly enhancing the quality of their

9 owners' lives; and

10 WHEREAS, the owners of assistance dogs have legal rights governing access to public

11 places; and

WHEREAS, individuals who falsely identify their companion dogs as assistance dogs and individuals who, with the intent to mislead, claim that their companion dogs are assistance dogs, negatively impact those who have a legitimate need to be accompanied by a highly trained assistance dog;

16 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF

17 NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

That the Legislative Management study whether properly trained assistance dogs providing legitimate service to their owners should be licensed or identified in a manner that readily distinguishes them from other companion dogs that are falsely or fraudulently claimed to be assistance dogs, whether special privileges such as waivers of local registration fees should be implemented for assistance dogs, and whether local ordinances do or could impede the acquisition and use of assistance dogs; and Sixty-fourth Legislative Assembly

- 2 recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to
- 3 the Sixty-fifth Legislative Assembly.
