1 A concurrent resolution urging the United States Senate Committee on the Judiciary to support 2 S. 2536, the Stop Advertising Victims of Exploitation (SAVE) Act, to provide for more stringent 3 inquiry into the age and circumstances of those whose availability is being advertised on 4 websites that facilitate human trafficking. 5 WHEREAS, according to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), human trafficking is the 6 fastest-growing business of organized crime in the world; and 7 WHEREAS, it is estimated human trafficking generates nearly \$150 billion each year in 8 illegal profits; and 9 WHEREAS, according to the FBI, nearly 300,000 American youths are at risk of becoming 10 victims of commercial sexual exploitation; and 11 WHEREAS, in just one week in June 2014, law enforcement arrested 281 alleged sex 12 traffickers and took 168 children out of prostitution in a nationwide FBI crackdown; and 13 WHEREAS, the use of adult services sections on websites has created virtual brothels 14 where children are bought and sold; and 15 WHEREAS, current federal law makes it difficult, if not impossible, for state and local law 16 enforcement authorities to hold accountable those who use Internet websites to promote illegal 17 trade in the sex trade, in particular those trafficking in minor children; 18 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE 19 **HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:** 20 That the Sixty-fourth Legislative Assembly urges the United States Senate Committee on 21 the Judiciary to support S. 2536, the Stop Advertising Victims of Exploitation (SAVE) Act, to

provide for more stringent inquiry into the age and circumstances of those whose availability is

being advertised on websites that facilitate human trafficking; and
