1 A concurrent resolution to create and enact a new section to article XI of the Constitution of

- 2 North Dakota, relating to creation of a state ethics commission.

STATEMENT OF INTENT

4 This measure would require the legislative assembly to establish a state ethics commission to

5 address ethical issues related to legislators and statewide officials and candidates.

6 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE

7 SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

- 8 That the following proposed new section to article XI of the Constitution of North Dakota is
- 9 agreed to and must be submitted to the qualified electors of North Dakota at the primary
- 10 election to be held in 2016, in accordance with section 16 of article IV of the Constitution of
- 11 North Dakota.

SECTION 1. A new section to article XI of the Constitution of North Dakota is created andenacted as follows:

- 14 <u>1.</u> <u>The legislative assembly shall provide by law for the creation of a state ethics</u>
- 15 <u>commission consisting of five members, one of whom must be appointed by the</u>
- 16 president pro tempore of the senate, one of whom must be appointed by the speaker
- 17 of the house, one of whom must be appointed by the governor, one of whom must be
- 18 appointed by the chief justice of the supreme court, and one of whom must be a
- 19 <u>citizen member appointed by the other members of the commission. The legislative</u>
- 20 <u>assembly shall ensure that no more than two members of the commission may be</u>
- 21 affiliated with the same political party and that regular four-year terms of members are
- 22 established so not more than two terms expire in any year.
- 23 <u>2.</u> <u>An ethics commission created by the legislative assembly must be granted the</u>
- 24 <u>authority to recommend legislation relating to its authority to address issues</u>
- 25 <u>concerning the conduct of statewide elected and appointed officers and members of</u>

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1	the legislative assembly, which must include statutory authority to examine campaign
2	conduct, campaign finance, and lobbying activities and laws; initiate investigations of
3	legislators, statewide elected and appointed officers, and candidates for legislative or
4	statewide office; investigate and impose civil penalties for violations of campaign
5	conduct and campaign finance laws, lobbying laws, and violations of other ethical
6	standards; subpoena documents and witnesses to testify under oath; and hire or
7	access nonpartisan staff services.
