- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact chapter 23-49 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating
- 2 to hospital discharge policies.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 **SECTION 1.** Chapter 23-49 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as

5 follows:

6 <u>23-49-01. Definitions.</u>

7 <u>As used in this chapter:</u>

- 8 <u>1.</u> <u>"Aftercare" means assistance related to a patient's condition at the time of discharge</u>
- 9 provided by an uncompensated caregiver to a patient after the patient's discharge.
- 10 <u>The term may include assistance with activities of daily living, instrumental activities of</u>
 11 <u>daily living, or medical or nursing tasks.</u>
- <u>"Discharge" means a patient's release from a hospital following the patient's admission</u>
 <u>to the hospital.</u>
- 14 <u>3.</u> <u>"Uncompensated caregiver" means an individual who, at the request of a patient,</u>
- agrees to provide, without compensation, aftercare to the patient in the patient's
 residence.

- 17 <u>23-49-02. Hospital discharge policies.</u>
- <u>A hospital shall establish and maintain written discharge policies. Components of the</u>
 <u>discharge policies must include:</u>
- 20 <u>a.</u> <u>Assessment of the patient's ability for self-care after discharge.</u>
- 21 b. Opportunity for the patient to designate an uncompensated caregiver.
- 22 <u>c.</u> <u>Documentation of an uncompensated caregiver designated by a patient.</u>
- 23d.Notification of the designated uncompensated caregiver of the patient's discharge24or transfer to another facility.
