- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new sections to chapter 39-24 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to accidents and liability; to amend and reenact sections 39-05-02.2,
- 3 39-24-01, 39-24-02, 39-24-03, 39-24-03.1, 39-24-04, 39-24-05, 39-24-06, 39-24-07, 39-24-08,

4 39-24-09, 39-24-09.1, 39-24-10, 39-24-11, and subsection 2 of section 57-40.3-01 of the North

5 Dakota Century Code, relating to the licensing of snowmobiles; and to provide an effective date.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 7 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 39-05-02.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 8 amended and reenacted as follows:

9 **39-05-02.2.** Exclusions from the certificate of title requirement.

- 10 A certificate of title need not be obtained for:
- 1. A vehicle owned by the United States unless it is registered in this state.
- A vehicle owned by a manufacturer or dealer and held for sale, even if incidentally
 moved on the highway or used for purposes of testing or demonstration, or a vehicle
 used by a manufacturer solely for testing.
- 15 3. A vehicle owned by a nonresident of this state and not required by law to be registered16 in this state.
- 17 4. A vehicle regularly engaged in interstate transportation of persons or property which is
- 18 registered in accordance with the international registration plan and for which a
- 19 currently effective certificate of title has been issued in another state that has a
- 20 reciprocal excise tax agreement with this state.
- 21 5. A vehicle moved solely by human or animal power.
- 22 6. Implements of husbandry.
- 23 7. Special mobile equipment.
- 24 8. A self-propelled wheelchair or tricycle for a mobility-impaired individual.

1	9.	Any vehicle which is driven or moved upon a highway only for the purpose of crossing		
2		the highway from one property to another. The vehicle shall cross the highway at an		
3		angle of approximately ninety degrees to the direction of the highway.		
4	10.	Other vehicles not required to be registered in this state or not required to display		
5		distinctive plates.		
6	11.	A manufactured home with respect to which the requirements of subsections 1		
7		through 3 of section 39-05-35, as applicable, have been satisfied.		
8	<u>12.</u>	A snowmobile as defined in section 39-24-01.		
9	SEC	TION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 39-24-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
10	amende	d and reenacted as follows:		
11	39-2	39-24-01. Definitions.		
12	For t	the purposes of this chapter:		
13	1.	"Collector snowmobile" means a snowmobile that is twenty-five years old or older, was		
14		originally produced as a separate identifiable make by a manufacturer, and is owned		
15		and operated solely as a collector's item.		
16	2.	"Dealer" means a person engaged in the business of buying, selling, or exchanging		
17		snowmobiles, who advertises or holds out to the public as being engaged in the		
18		buying, selling, or exchanging of snowmobiles, or who engages in the buying of		
19		snowmobiles for resale.		
20	3.	"License" means the act of assigning a license number to a snowmobile.		
21	<u>4.</u>	"Operate" means to ride in or on and control the operation of a snowmobile.		
22	<u>4.5.</u>	"Operator" means every person who operates or is in actual physical control of a		
23		snowmobile.		
24	<u>5.6.</u>	"Owner" means a person, other than a lienholder, having the property in or title to a		
25		snowmobile and who is entitled to the use or possession of that snowmobile.		
26	6.	"Register" means the act of assigning a registration number to a snowmobile.		
27	7.	"Roadway" means that portion of a highway improved, designed, or ordinarily used for		
28		vehicular travel.		
29	8.	"Snowmobile" means a self-propelled vehicle intended for off-road travel primarily on		
30		snow, having a curb weight of not more than one thousand two hundred pounds		
31		[544.31 kilograms], driven by track or tracks in contact with the snow, steered by a ski		

1		or skis in contact with the snow, and which is not wider than forty-eight inches
2		[121.92 centimeters]. The term does not include an off-highway vehicle as defined in
3		chapter 39-29 converted to operate on tracks.
4	SEC	TION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 39-24-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is
5	amende	d and reenacted as follows:
6	39-2	4-02. Snowmobile registrationlicensing - Title certificateldentification numbers -
7	General	requirements.
8	<u>1.</u>	Except as hereinafterotherwise provided in this section, noa person may not operate
9		or give permission to operate any snowmobile unless the snowmobile has been
10		registerednumbered and licensed in accordance with the provisions of this chapter.
11	<u>2.</u>	Any snowmobile purchased after July 1, 1973, must be titled under the provisions of
12		chapter 39-05numbered and licensed in order to be operated under the provisions of
13		this section. Any snowmobile purchased prior tobefore July 1, 1973, may be titled
14		under the provisions of chapter 39-05numbered and licensed.
15	SEC	TION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 39-24-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is
16	amende	d and reenacted as follows:
17	39-2	4-03. Registration - Application - Issuance - Fees - Renewal.
18	1.	Application for registrationa license must be made to the parks and recreation
19		department in a form as the parks and recreation department shall prescribe and
20		furnish and must state the name and address of every owner of the snowmobile and
21		be signed by at least one owner. A copy of the application must be carried on the
22		person when operating and shall serve as evidence of registrationa recent and current
23		license for a period of not more than thirty days from the date of application.
24	2.	Upon receipt of the application in approved form and the appropriate fee, the parks
25		and recreation department shall register arecord the application and issue the
26		applicant a license with an identification number awarded the snowmobile and assign
27		a registration number and a certificate of registration. The registrationowner shall
28		securely attach to each side of the snowmobile the identification number must be at
29		least one and one-half inches [3.81 centimeters] in height and of a reflectorized
30		material and must be securely affixed on each side of the snowmobile in a position as-
31		to provide clear legibility for identification. The certificate of registrationlicense must

1		include information regarding the make, year, serial number, and name and address of	
2		the owner. The fee for registrationlicensing of each snowmobile must be fivesixty	
3		dollars for any portion of the registrationlicensing period and the registrationlicensing	
4		period is for two years beginning October first of each odd-numbered year. The fee for	
5		a duplicate or replacement registrationlicense identification number or	
6		registrationlicense card whichor decal that is lost, mutilated, or becomes illegible may	
7		not exceed five dollars. In addition, in each year that fees are collected for the	
8		unsatisfied judgment fund there must be assessed a fee of one dollar per year for	
9		each snowmobile registeredlicensed, which must be placed in the unsatisfied	
10		judgment fund. For each snowmobile registered under the provisions of this chapter,	
11		there must be assessed a snowmobile trail tax in the amount of thirty-five dollars.	
12	3.	Every owner of a snowmobile shall renew the registrationlicense in a manner as the	
13		parks and recreation department shall prescribe, upon payment of the same	
14		registrationlicensing fees provided in this section.	
15	4.	Upon application for registrationa license as prescribed in this section, any	
16		snowmobile dealer as defined in section 39-24-01 must be issued registrationlicense	
17		identification numbers distinctively marked as dealer's registrationlicense identification	
18		numbers upon payment of the appropriate fee as prescribed in this section. The	
19		dealer's registrationlicense identification numbers must be used only on snowmobiles	
20		owned by the dealership.	
21	<u>5.</u>	While operating a snowmobile, the identification number awarded to a snowmobile	
22		dealer must be properly displayed and valid.	
23	SEC	CTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 39-24-03.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
24	amende	d and reenacted as follows:	
25	39-2	24-03.1. Snowmobile safety fees.	
26	Upo	n the sale of a new or used snowmobile and in addition to other fees and taxes	
27	imposed under section 39-24-03, a dealer shall collect a five dollar safety fee from the buyer.		
28	Within fifteen days after the end of each calendar quarter, the dealer shall file a report with the		
29	parks ar	nd recreation department which discloses the number of snowmobiles sold during that	
30	calenda	r quarter and includes fees collected from the buyer. Fees imposed under this section	
31	must be	deposited in the state snowmobile fund established under section 39-24-05. The parks	

1	and recreation department may use these funds solely for snowmobile safety education and			
2	promotion. The parks and recreation department shall report to the director within thirty days of			
3	the end	of ea	ch calendar quarter the motor-powered recreational vehicle dealers that submitted	
4	a safety	fee r	eport and the number of vehicles sold, and shall identify every dealer not collecting-	
5	or transr	nittin	g snowmobile safety fees.	
6	SEC		N 6. AMENDMENT. Section 39-24-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
7	amende	d and	d reenacted as follows:	
8	39-2	24-04	. Exemption from registrationlicense - Exemption from fees.	
9	1.	A re	egistrationlicense number must be issued without the payment of a fee for	
10		snov	wmobiles owned by the state of North Dakota or any of its political subdivisions	
11		upo	n application for the registration.	
12	2.	No I	registration <u>A license</u> or feesfee may not be required of:	
13		a.	Snowmobiles owned and used by the United States or another state or its	
14			political subdivisions.	
15		b.	Snowmobiles registered or licensed in a country other than the United States and	
16			temporarily used within this state.	
17		C.	Snowmobiles validly licensed in another state and which have not been within	
18			this state for more than thirty consecutive days.	
19		d.	Snowmobiles operated solely upon lands owned or leased by the snowmobile	
20			owner.	
21		e.	Snowmobiles incapable of speeds in excess of ten miles per hour and with an	
22			engine displacement of less than one hundred cubic centimeters.	
23		f.	Collector snowmobiles. The director of the parks and recreation department may	
24			issue a special permit to a person to operate in a parade; organized group	
25			outings, including races, rallies, or other promotional events; and for up to	
26			ten days each year for personal transportation. The director of the parks and	
27			recreation department may impose a reasonable restriction of a permittee and	
28			may revoke, amend, suspend, or modify a permit for cause.	
29	3.	lf a	snowmobile is exempt from registrationlicensing under subdivision b or c of	
30		sub	section 2, the owner is required to purchase an out-of-state public trails and lands	
31		acce	ess permit received upon payment of a fifteentwenty dollar per year fee. The	

1 permit must be in the operator's possession when that individual is operating the 2 snowmobile within the state. Dealers or other agents authorized by the director of the 3 parks and recreation department who sell out-of-state public trails and lands access 4 permits may retain one dollar of the fifteen dollar per year fee and the remainder of the 5 fees collected under this subsection must be deposited in the state snowmobile fund. 6 SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 39-24-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is 7 amended and reenacted as follows: 8 39-24-05. Disposition of registrationlicense fees and trail tax - Transfer from highway 9 tax distribution fund. 10 Fees from registrationlicensing of snowmobiles must be deposited with the state treasurer 11 and credited to the highway tax distribution fundwho shall credit the funds to the parks and 12 recreation department to pay for the costs of administering this chapter. The assessed 13 snowmobile trail taxlicense fee must be deposited in a state snowmobile fund in the state 14 treasury. Additionally, an amount equal to the tax collected on thirty gallons [113.56 liters] of 15 motor vehicle fuel multiplied by the number of collector snowmobiles and snowmobiles 16 registered licensed under this chapter must be transferred annually from the highway tax 17 distribution fund, before allocation of the fund under section 54-27-19, and credited to the state 18 snowmobile fund. The parks and recreation department may, upon appropriation by the 19 legislative assembly, expend from such the fund moneys it deems necessary for purposes of 20 administering snowmobile safety programs and establishing and maintaining snowmobile 21 facilities and programs. 22 SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 39-24-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is 23 amended and reenacted as follows: 24 39-24-06. Transfer or termination of snowmobile ownership or change of address of 25 owner. 26 Within fifteen days after the transfer of ownership, or any part thereof of ownership, other 27 than a security interest, or the theft, destruction, or abandonment of any snowmobile, or a 28 change of address of the owner as listed with the application for registration license, written 29 notice thereof of the transfer of any of these changes must be given by the owner to the director

30 <u>of the parks and recreation department</u> in such<u>a</u> form as must be prescribed by the director <u>of</u>

31 the parks and recreation department. The transfer, theft, destruction, or abandonment

- 1 terminates the certificate of number and license for the snowmobile except that, in the case of a
- 2 transfer of a part interest which does not affect the owner's right to operate the snowmobile, the
- 3 transfer does not terminate the identification number and license.
- 4 SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 39-24-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 5 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 6 **39-24-07. Licensing by political subdivisions.**
- NoA political subdivision of this state may <u>not</u> require licensing or <u>other</u> registration of
 snowmobiles subject to the provisions of this chapter.
- 9 **SECTION 10. AMENDMENT.** Section 39-24-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is

10 amended and reenacted as follows:

11 **39-24-08.** Rules and regulations.

12 Pursuant to this code and this chapter, rules<u>Rules</u> for the regulation and use of

- 13 snowmobiles must be adopted as follows:
- The director <u>of the parks and recreation department</u> shall adopt rules for the
 registration<u>licensing</u> of snowmobiles and display of registration<u>licensing</u> identification
 numbers <u>as to provide clear legibility for identification</u>.
- 17 2. The director of the department of transportation has the authority in the interest of 18 public health, welfare, and safety to regulate, restrict, or prohibit, by rule, the operation 19 of snowmobiles on those highways under the director's jurisdiction of the director of 20 the department of transportation. The director's authority of the director of the 21 department of transportation to prohibit the use of snowmobiles is limited to the 22 roadways, shoulders, inslopes, and medians within the right of way, except where 23 such action is necessary to avoid an obstacle. Notwithstanding the racing prohibitions 24 in section 39-08-03.1, the director of the department of transportation may, on a 25 case-by-case basis, permit organized and bona fide snowmobile races on the ditch 26 bottoms, backslopes, and the top of the backslopes of the highway rights of way under 27 the director's jurisdiction of the director of the department of transportation. The 28 planning, organization, route selection, and safety precautions of any such race are 29 the sole responsibility of the permittee. It is expressly provided that the director of the 30 department of transportation, and the transportation department and the employees 31 thereof, shall incur no liability whatsoever for permitting such races.

1	3.	The	director of the parks and recreation department shall adopt rules for regulating	
2		use	of snowmobiles in state parks and other state-owned land under the supervision	
3		of th	e director of the parks and recreation department.	
4	4.	The	governing bodies of political subdivisions shall promulgate rules and regulations	
5		for r	egulating use of snowmobiles in recreation and other appropriate areas under	
6		their	r jurisdiction. The governing bodies of cities may, by ordinance, regulate, restrict,	
7		and	prohibit the use of snowmobiles when operated within the exclusive jurisdiction of	
8		citie	S.	
9	SEC		11. AMENDMENT. Section 39-24-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
10	amende	d and	I reenacted as follows:	
11	39-2	9-24-09. Rules for operation of snowmobiles.		
12	1.	No <u>A</u>	person may not operate a snowmobile upon the roadway, shoulder, or inside	
13		banl	k or slope of any road, street, or highway in this state except as provided pursuant	
14		to in	this chapter. No <u>A person may not operate a</u> snowmobile may be operated at any	
15		time	within the right of way of any interstate highway within this state except as	
16		prov	vided in this section.	
17	2.	Asn	owmobile may make a direct crossing of a non-interstate street or highway	
18		prov	vided:	
19		a.	The crossing is made at an angle of approximately ninety degrees to the direction	
20			of the highway and at a place where no obstruction prevents a quick and safe	
21			crossing;	
22		b.	The snowmobile is brought to a complete stop before crossing the shoulder or	
23			main traveled way of the highway;	
24		C.	The driver yields the right of way to all oncoming traffic which constitutes an	
25			immediate hazard; and	
26		d.	In crossing a divided highway, the crossing is made only at an intersection of	
27			such highway with another public street or highway.	
28	3.	No <u>A</u>	person may not operate a snowmobile may be operated unless it is equipped with	
29		at le	ast one headlamp, one tail-lamp, and brakes, all in working order, which conform	
30		to st	andards prescribed by rule of the director pursuant to the authority vested in the	
31		dire	ctor by this code and this chapterof the department of transportation.	

1	4.	The emergency conditions under which a snowmobile may be operated other than as
2		provided by this chapter must be such as to render the use of an automobile
3		impractical under such conditions at such period of time and location.
4	5.	It is unlawful for any person to drive or operate any snowmobile in the following ways
5		which are declared to be unsafe and a public nuisance:
6		a. At a rate of speed greater than reasonable or proper under all the surrounding
7		circumstances.
8		b. In a careless, reckless, or negligent manner so as to endanger the person or
9		property of another or to cause injury or damage to suchthe person or property.
10		or to chase or harass wildlife, or in any manner that is not reasonable or prudent
11		under the circumstances.
12		c. While under the influence of intoxicating liquor or a drug as defined in section
13		39-24.1-01, or a combination thereof.
14		d. Without a lighted headlamp and tail-lamp when required for safety.
15		e. In any tree nursery or planting in a manner which damages or destroys growing
16		stock.
17		f. Without a manufacturer-installed or equivalent muffler in good working order and
18		connected to the snowmobile exhaust system.
19		g. Upon any private land where the private land is posted by the owner or tenant
20		prohibiting trespassing. The name of the person posting the land must appear on
21		each sign in legible characters. The posted signs must be readable from the
22		outside of the land and must be placed conspicuously at a distance of not more
23		than eight hundred eighty yards [804.68 meters] apart, provided further that as to
24		land entirely enclosed by a fence or other enclosure, posting of signs at or on all
25		gates through the fence or enclosure constitutes a posting of all the enclosed
26		lands.
27	6.	It is unlawful for any person to operate a snowmobile pursuant tounder this chapter
28		39-24 without having in possession a valid driver's license, except as provided by
29		section 39-24-09.1.
30	7.	If a snowmobile is operated within the right of way of any road, street, or highway of
31		this state under this chapter, during times or conditions that warrant the use of lights,

1		the snowmobile operator shall travel in the same direction as the direction of motor
2		vehicles traveling on the side of the roadway immediately adjacent to the side of the
3		right of way traveled by the snowmobile. An operator of a snowmobile traveling on a
4		snowmobile trail maintained by the parks and recreation department which is within
5		the right of way of any road, street, or highway of this state is exempted from this rule.
6		The operator shall wait for all traffic to clear the roadway before crossing bridges and
7		other similar structures.
8	8.	It is unlawful for any person to operate a snowmobile within a highway right of way as
9		defined in subsection 38 of section 24-01-01.1 between April first and November first
10		of any year.
11	9.	NoA person may not operate a snowmobile may be operated at any time within the
12		right of way of any highway within this state while towing a sled, skid, or other vehicle,
13		unless the sled, skid, or other vehicle is connected to the snowmobile by a hinged
14		swivel and secure hitch.
15	10.	NoA person under the age of eighteen years may not operate, ride, or otherwise be
16		propelled on a snowmobile unless the person wears a safety helmet meeting United
17		States department of transportation standards.
18	11.	A person may not operate a snowmobile, and an owner of a snowmobile may not
19		knowingly permit the snowmobile to be operated, upon any property maintained,
20		leased, or owned by the state parks and recreation department to which the public has
21		a right of access for snowmobile or other vehicular use, without a policy of liability
22		insurance which insures the person named, and any person using the snowmobile
23		with the express or implied permission of the person named, against loss from the
24		liability imposed by law for damages arising out of the ownership, maintenance, or use
25		of the snowmobile within this state, subject to the following limits, exclusive of interest
26		and costs, with respect to each snowmobile: twenty-five thousand dollars because of
27		bodily injury to or death of one person in any one accident and, subject to the limit for
28		one person, fifty thousand dollars because of bodily injury to or death of two or more
29		persons in any one accident, and twenty-five thousand dollars because of injury to or
30		destruction of property of others in any one accident. Upon request of a law

1 enforcement officer, a person operating a snowmobile shall provide proof of liability 2 insurance to that officer within twenty days. 3 12. A snowmobileperson may not be operated operate a snowmobile within the right of 4 way of any interstate highway within this state except: 5 For emergency purposes; or a. 6 b. Across an interstate highway on an overpass or underpass, except where 7 otherwise prohibited by law or by signing, provided the snowmobile crosses on 8 the extreme right side of the overpass or underpass. 9 13. A person may not cause or knowingly permit a minor under twelve years of age to 10 operate a snowmobile unless the minor is otherwise authorized by this section. 11 SECTION 12. AMENDMENT. Section 39-24-09.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is 12 amended and reenacted as follows: 13 39-24-09.1. Operation by individuals at least twelve years of age. 14 An individual twelve years of age and over may not operate a snowmobile unless the 15 individual is in possession of a valid driver's license, operates the snowmobile on private land, 16 or unless the individual has completed a snowmobile safety training course as prescribed by the 17 director of the parks and recreation department pursuant to chapter 28-32 and has received the 18 appropriate snowmobile safety certificate issued by the director of the department of 19 transportation parks and recreation department. The failure of an operator to exhibit a 20 snowmobile safety certificate upon demand to any official authorized to enforce this chapter is 21 presumptive evidence that the individual is not the holder of the certificate. Fees collected from 22 each individual receiving certification must be deposited into the snowmobile trail tax fund for 23 purposes of establishing snowmobile safety programs. 24 SECTION 13. AMENDMENT. Section 39-24-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is 25 amended and reenacted as follows: 26 39-24-10. Enforcement. 27 Peace officers of this state and their respective duly authorized representatives are hereby-28 authorized to enforce the provisions of this chapter and in the exercise of these provisions have 29 the authority to stop any snowmobile subject to this chapter. 30 SECTION 14. AMENDMENT. Section 39-24-11 of the North Dakota Century Code is 31 amended and reenacted as follows:

1 **39-24-11**. Penalties.

2 Any person who violates subsection 12 of section 39-24-09 must be assessed a fee of one 3 hundred dollars. Any person who violates subdivision b or g of subsection 5 of section 39-24-09 4 is guilty of a class B misdemeanor. Any person who violates subdivision c of subsection 5 of 5 section 39-24-09 is guilty of an infraction or a class B misdemeanor as determined by section 6 39-24.1-07. Any person who violates subsection 11 of section 39-24-09 is guilty of a class B 7 misdemeanor and must be assessed a fine of at least one hundred dollars. Any person who 8 violates any other provision of section 39-24-09 must be assessed a fee of twenty dollars. Any 9 person, unless specifically exempted, who fails to registerlicense or fails to display a decal as 10 required by sections 39-24-02 and 39-24-04 must be assessed a fee of fifty dollars. If the 11 person provides proof of registrationlicensing after the violation, the fee may be reduced by 12 one-half. Any person who violates any other provision of this chapter for which a specific 13 penalty is not provided must be assessed a fee of ten dollars.

SECTION 15. Two new sections to chapter 39-24 of the North Dakota Century Code are
 created and enacted as follows:

16 Collisions, accidents, casualties, and liability.

- The operator of a snowmobile involved in a collision, accident, or other casualty, so far as that person can do so without serious danger to that person and that snowmobile's passengers, shall render to other persons affected by the collision, accident, or other casualty assistance as may be practicable and necessary to save them from or
- 21 minimize any danger caused by the collision, accident, or other casualty. That person
- 22 also shall give that person's name, address, and snowmobile identification in writing to
- 23 any person injured and to the owner of any property damaged in the collision,
- 24 accident, or other casualty. If a collision, accident, or other casualty involving a
- 25 snowmobile results in death or injury to a person or damage to property in excess of
- 26 an amount specified by the director of parks and recreation by rule, the operator of the
- 27 snowmobile shall file with the parks and recreation department a full description of the
- 28 <u>collision, accident, or other casualty, including such information as the director of the</u>
- 29 parks and recreation department may require by rule.
- 30 2. Any operator of a snowmobile, or other person who complies with this section or who
 31 gratuitously and in good faith renders assistance at the scene of a snowmobile

1	collision, accident, or other casualty without objection of any person assisted may not
2	be held liable for any civil damages as a result of the rendering of assistance or for
3	any act or omission in providing or arranging salvage, towage, medical treatment, or
4	other assistance where the assisting person acts as an ordinary, reasonably prudent
5	person would have acted under the same or similar circumstances.
6	Owner's civil liability.
7	The owner of a snowmobile is liable for any injury or damage caused by the negligent
8	operation of the snowmobile. The owner is not liable, however, unless the snowmobile is being
9	used with the owner's express or implied consent. It must be presumed that the snowmobile is
10	being operated with the knowledge and consent of the owner, if at the time of the injury or
11	damage it is under the control of the owner's spouse, father, mother, brother, sister, son, or
12	daughter. This section does not relieve any other person from any liability that person would
13	otherwise have and does not authorize or permit any recovery in excess of injury or damage
14	actually incurred.
15	SECTION 16. AMENDMENT. Subsection 2 of section 57-40.3-01 of the North Dakota
16	Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
17	2. "Motor vehicle" includes every vehicle that is self-propelled and every vehicle that is
18	propelled by electric power obtained from overhead trolley wires, but not operated
19	upon rails, every trailer, semitrailer, park model trailer as defined in subsection 2 of
20	section 57-55-10, off-highway vehicle, snowmobile, low-speed vehicle, and travel
21	trailer for which a certificate of title is required to be obtained under chapter 39-05, but
22	not including snowmobiles, housetrailers or mobile homes.
23	SECTION 17. EXPIRATION DATE. This Act becomes effective on July 1, 2016.
