

**FIRST ENGROSSMENT
with Conference Committee Amendments
ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2033**

Introduced by

Legislative Management
(Health Services Committee)

1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 4 of section 43-41-04, sections 43-41-07
2 and 43-47-06, and subsection 7 of section 43-53-01 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating
3 to licensure requirements for behavioral health professionals; and to provide for a report to the
4 legislative management.

5 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

6 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 4 of section 43-41-04 of the North Dakota Century
7 Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

- 8 4. ~~The board shall issue~~To obtain a license as a licensed independent to practice clinical
9 ~~social worker to work,~~ an applicant for licensure by examination shall submit to the
10 board a written application in the form prescribed by the board and provide satisfactory
11 evidence the applicant who:
- 12 a. Has a doctorate or master's degree in social work from ~~a college or university~~an
13 approved social work program.
 - 14 b. ~~Has passed~~Passed an examination approved by the board for this purpose.
 - 15 c. ~~Has satisfied the board that within~~Within a four-year period ~~the applicant has~~-
16 successfully completed three thousand hours of supervised post-master's clinical
17 social work experience. The initial one thousand five hundred of the required
18 hours must have been under the supervision of a licensed-independent clinical
19 social worker, or, if, Additional hours of supervision may be under other qualified
20 mental health professionals approved by the board if barriers due to the
21 geographical location, disability, or other factors determined by the board to
22 create a hardship exist for the applicant. The qualified professional must be
23 registered or otherwise qualified as a clinical supervisor by the board that
24 licenses the other professional. However, if an applicant began that supervised

1 ~~post-master's~~ clinical social work experience before August 1, 2009, a licensed-
2 ~~certified~~ ~~master's~~ social worker who has two years of experience, a licensed
3 psychologist with a doctorate degree, or a licensed psychiatrist may have
4 supervised the required hours. The applicant may demonstrate to the board's
5 satisfaction that experience in the practice of clinical social work meets or
6 exceeds the minimum supervisory requirements of the board.

7 d. ~~Has satisfied the board that the applicant agrees~~ Agrees to adhere to the code of
8 social work ethics adopted by the board.

9 e. Is of good moral character. In determining the character of an applicant in a
10 licensure decision, the board shall consider information obtained through reports
11 made under section 43-41-04.2.

12 f. Paid all applicable fees specified by the board regarding the licensure process.

13 **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-41-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is
14 amended and reenacted as follows:

15 **43-41-07. Qualification for licensure by an applicant licensed in another jurisdiction.**

16 An applicant may be granted a license upon satisfactory proof to the board that the
17 applicant is licensed in good standing under the laws of another jurisdiction that imposes
18 substantially the same requirements as this chapter and a board determination that at the time
19 of application for licensure under this section the applicant possesses qualifications or
20 experience in the practice of social work which are substantially similar to the minimum
21 requirements under this chapter. The applicant shall pay the licensure fees specified by the
22 board.

23 **SECTION 3. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-47-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is
24 amended and reenacted as follows:

25 **43-47-06. Licenses - Qualifications - Reciprocity.**

- 26 1. Except as otherwise provided in this chapter, ~~no~~ a person may not engage in
27 counseling in this state unless that person is a licensed professional counselor or
28 licensed associate professional counselor.
- 29 2. The board shall issue a license as a licensed professional counselor to each applicant
30 who files an application upon a form and in a manner the board prescribes,

1 accompanied by the required fee, and who furnishes evidence to the board that the
2 applicant:

- 3 a. Has received a master's degree from an accredited school or college in
4 counseling or other program that meets the academic and training standards
5 adopted by the board;
- 6 b. ~~Has provided~~Provided personal and professional recommendations that meet the
7 requirements adopted by the board and ~~has~~ satisfied the board that the applicant
8 will adhere to the highest standards of the profession of counseling;
- 9 c. Has two years of supervised experience, at least fifty percent of which must have
10 been under a licensed professional counselor, or its equivalent as determined by
11 the board, and the additional supervised experience may have been with other
12 qualified professionals designated by the board which are competent in the area
13 of practice being supervised, if barriers due to geographical location, disability, or
14 other factors determined by the board to create a hardship exist for the applicant.
15 The qualified professional must be registered or otherwise qualified as a clinical
16 supervisor by the board that licenses the other professional;
- 17 d. ~~Has provided~~Provided a statement of professional intent to practice in this state
18 describing the applicant's proposed use of the license, the intended client
19 population, and the counseling procedures, as defined by the board, the
20 applicant intends to use in serving the client population; and
- 21 e. Has demonstrated knowledge in the field of counseling by successful completion
22 of an examination prescribed by the board.

23 3. The board shall issue a license as a licensed associate professional counselor to each
24 applicant who files an application upon a form and in a manner the board prescribes,
25 accompanied by the required fee, and who furnishes sufficient evidence to the board
26 that the applicant:

- 27 a. Has received a master's degree from an accredited school or college in
28 counseling or other program that meets the academic and training standards
29 adopted by the board;

- 1 b. ~~Has provided~~Provided personal and professional recommendations that meet the
2 requirements adopted by the board and has satisfied the board that the applicant
3 will adhere to the standards of the profession of counseling; and
- 4 c. ~~Has provided~~Provided a written plan for supervised experience which meets the
5 requirements adopted by the board.
- 6 4. The board may waive the formal examination requirements for a professional
7 counselor license ~~when~~if the applicant has been licensed or certified to practice
8 counseling in another state under standards and qualifications similar to or greater
9 than those set by the board.
- 10 5. A professional counselor shall renew the license every two years. The board shall
11 renew a license upon payment of a fee set by the board and upon demonstration by
12 the licenseholder of completion of continuing education requirements set by the board.
- 13 6. An associate professional counselor initially licensed under this chapter may be
14 licensed for no more than two years. The associate professional counselor's license
15 may not be extended beyond two years ~~only~~, except upon recommendation of the
16 associate professional counselor's supervisor and three other counselors, at least one
17 of whom must be a professor from the associate professional counselor's training
18 program.

19 **SECTION 4. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 7 of section 43-53-01 of the North Dakota Century
20 Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

- 21 7. "Qualified supervision" means the supervision of clinical services, in accordance with
22 standards established by the board, by an individual who has been recognized by the
23 board as an approved supervisor. At least fifty percent of the hours of qualified
24 supervision must be with an approved supervisor who is a licensed marriage and
25 family therapist and additional hours of qualified supervision may be with other
26 professionals designated by the approved supervisor and acting under the approved
27 supervisor. The other professional must be approved by the board, approved by that
28 individual's licensing authority to supervise interns if appropriate, and competent in the
29 area of practice being supervised. The marriage and family therapist approved
30 supervisor remains the applicant's supervisor of record.

1 **SECTION 5. BEHAVIORAL HEALTH PROFESSIONAL BOARDS - REPORT TO**
2 **LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT.** During the 2017-18 interim, the North Dakota board of social
3 work examiners, board of addiction counseling examiners, board of counselor examiners, and
4 North Dakota marriage and family therapy licensure board shall report to the legislative
5 management on the status of implementation of supervision and training requirements provided
6 in this Act.
