1 | A BILL for an Act to create and enact ~~subsection~~subsections 4 and 5 to section 54-61-02 of the  
2 | North Dakota Century Code, relating to access to confidential records by the commission on  
3 | legal counsel for indigents.

4 | **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

5 | **SECTION 1.** Subsection 4 to section 54-61-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is created  
6 | and enacted as follows:

7 | 4. Notwithstanding any provision of state law making the records confidential, but subject  
8 | to any prohibitions in federal law, in addition to or in lieu of a subpoena, in determining  
9 | eligibility for public defender services the commission may obtain access, including  
10 | automated access in the case of records maintained in automated databases, to:

11 | a. ~~Records~~All records of other state and local government agencies, including:

12 | (1) Vital statistics, including records of marriage, birth, and divorce;

13 | (2) Local tax and revenue records, including information on residence address,  
14 | employer, income, and assets;

15 | (3) Records concerning real and titled personal property;

16 | (4) Records of occupational and professional licenses and records concerning  
17 | the ownership and control of corporations, partnerships, and other business  
18 | entities;

19 | (5) Employment security records;

20 | (6) Workforce safety and insurance records pursuant to a release signed by an  
21 | individual identifying the last-known address of ~~an~~the individual, wage-loss  
22 | benefits, permanent partial impairment benefits, death benefits, or additional  
23 | benefits that individual has received or is entitled to receive from the  
24 | organization, and whether and where that individual is employed;

- 1           (7) Records of all agencies administering public assistance programs;  
2           (8) Records of the department of transportation, which access is not subject to  
3           the requirements in section ~~39-16-13~~39-16-03;  
4           (9) Corrections records;  
5           (10) Law enforcement records; and  
6           (11) Subject to an agreement with the state tax commissioner, state tax and  
7           revenue records, including information on residence address, employer,  
8           income, and assets; and  
9        b. Certain information contained in records held by private entities, subject to  
10       safeguards on privacy and information security, consisting of:  
11        (1) The name, address, social security number, and other requested relevant  
12        income or asset information of the individual and the name and address of  
13        the employer of the individual, as appearing in customer records of public  
14        utilities, including cellular and wireless telephone service providers and  
15        cable television companies, pursuant to an administrative subpoena if  
16        requested; and  
17        (2) Information on assets and liabilities of the individual held by financial  
18        institutions.

19        **SECTION 2.** Subsection 5 to section 51-61-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is created  
20 and enacted as follows:

21        5. If a government agency or private entity denies the commission access to records  
22        under subsection 4, the denial must include a statement of the legal authority for the  
23        denial.
