ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2018

1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of
2 commerce; to provide exemptions; to provide for transfers; to provide for a report; and to
3 declare an emergency.

4 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

5 **SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds
6 as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state
7 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and
8 other income, to the department of commerce for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the
9 department of commerce, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019,
10 as follows:

SECTION 2. HEALTH INSURANCE INCREASE. The salaries line item in section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$172,554, of which \$135,102 is from the general fund, for increases in employee health insurance premiums from \$1,130 to \$1,241 per month.

SECTION 3. ONE-TIME FUNDING - EFFECT ON BASE BUDGET - REPORT TO THE SIXTY-SIXTH LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY. The following amounts reflect the one-time funding items approved by the sixty-fourth legislative assembly for the 2015-17 biennium:

12 The 2017-19 biennium one-time funding amounts are not a part of the entity's base budget for
 13 the 2019-21 biennium. The department of commerce shall report to the appropriations
 14 committees of the sixty-sixth legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the
 15 biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019.

16 **SECTION 4. EXEMPTION.** The amount appropriated for the agricultural products utilization
 17 commission in section 1 of chapter 18 of the 2015 Session Laws is not subject to section
 18 54-44.1-11 and any unexpended funds from this line item for grants are available for grants
 19 during the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019.

20 **SECTION 5. EXEMPTION.** The amount appropriated for the discretionary funds line item in
 21 section 1 of chapter 18 of the 2015 Session Laws is not subject to section 54-44.1-11 and any
 22 unexpended funds from this line item are available during the biennium beginning July 1, 2017,
 23 and ending June 30, 2019.

24 **SECTION 6. EXEMPTION.** ~~The~~Of the amount appropriated for the unmanned aircraft
 25 systems program in section 1 of chapter 18 of the 2015 Session Laws up to \$1,000,000 is not
 26 subject to section 54-44.1-11 and ~~any~~ unexpended funds from this ~~program~~amount are
 27 available and may be spent during the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30,
 28 2019.

29 ~~**SECTION 7. EXEMPTION.** The amount appropriated for prekindergarten community grants~~
 30 ~~in section 1 of chapter 18 of the 2015 Session Laws is not subject to section 54-44.1-11 and any~~

1 ~~unexpended funds from these grants are available for grants during the biennium beginning~~
2 ~~July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019.~~

3 **SECTION 7. TRANSFER - INTERNSHIP FUND.** The office of management and budget
4 shall transfer ~~\$1,275,000~~\$950,000 of the amount appropriated in the operating expenses line
5 item in section 1 of this Act to the internship fund for the purpose of administering the operation
6 intern program, for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending June 30,
7 2019.

8 **SECTION 8. STRATEGIC INVESTMENT AND IMPROVEMENTS FUND - BASE**
9 **RETENTION GRANT PROGRAM.** The grants line item and the estimated income line item in
10 section 1 of this Act include the sum of ~~\$1,000,000~~\$600,000 from the strategic investment and
11 improvements fund for a base retention grant program to be developed by the department of
12 commerce, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019. The grant
13 program must award direct grants and not cost reimbursement grants. The department may
14 award grants of \$200,000 to each community with an air force base or air national guard
15 facilities.

16 **SECTION 9. STRATEGIC INVESTMENT AND IMPROVEMENTS FUND - UNMANNED**
17 **AIRCRAFT SYSTEMS PROGRAM.** The grants line item and the estimated income line item in
18 section 1 of this Act include the sum of \$2,000,000 from the strategic investment and
19 improvements fund for operations of the unmanned aircraft systems test site, for the biennium
20 beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019. The department of commerce shall consult
21 with the aeronautics commission regarding test site operational costs and support services and
22 best practices related to the unmanned aircraft systems test site.

23 **SECTION 10. STRATEGIC INVESTMENT AND IMPROVEMENTS FUND - ENHANCED**
24 **USE LEASE GRANT PROGRAM.** The grants line item and the estimated income line item in
25 section 1 of this Act include the sum of \$3,000,000, of which \$1,000,000 is from the general
26 fund and \$2,000,000 is from the strategic investment and improvements fund for an enhanced
27 use lease grant program ~~for the operations of the unmanned aircraft systems test site~~, for the
28 biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019. Grants must be awarded for
29 initiatives related to the unmanned aircraft system industry in North Dakota, including for the
30 purposes of infrastructure, research, development, the creation of software, and the purchase of
31 equipment benefiting the unmanned aircraft system. The department of commerce shall require

1 grant recipients to provide matching funds in the form of cash, property, or in-kind consideration,
2 totaling \$1,000,000 for the grants awarded under this program.

3 **SECTION 11. TRADE OFFICE - MATCHING FUND REQUIREMENT.** The ~~total~~ North
4 Dakota trade office line item and the general fund appropriation in section 1 of this Act include
5 ~~\$2,281,498~~ \$2,000,000 of funding relating to the North Dakota trade office. The department of
6 commerce may spend ~~seventy~~ sixty percent of this amount without requiring any matching funds
7 from the trade office. Any additional amounts may be spent only to the extent the North Dakota
8 trade office provides one dollar of matching funds from private or other public sources for each
9 one dollar provided by the department for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending
10 June 30, 2019. Matching funds may include money spent by businesses or organizations to pay
11 salaries to export assistants, provide training to export assistants, or buy computer equipment
12 as part of the North Dakota trade office's export assistance program.

13 **SECTION 12. ENTREPRENEURSHIP GRANTS AND VOUCHER PROGRAM -**
14 **EXEMPTION.** Section 1 of this Act includes the sum of ~~\$1,500,000~~ \$2,250,000, of which
15 ~~\$1,350,000~~ \$600,000 is from the general fund and ~~\$150,000~~ \$1,650,000 is from special funds,
16 for an entrepreneurship grants and voucher program to be developed and administered by the
17 department of commerce, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019.
18 Of the amount appropriated, \$900,000 is to be distributed equally to entrepreneurial centers
19 located in Bismarck, Fargo, and Grand Forks, \$300,000 to an organization that provides
20 workplace safety, and \$300,000 for biotechnology grants. The department shall establish
21 guidelines to provide grants to entrepreneurial centers certified by the department. The
22 department also shall establish guidelines to award vouchers to entrepreneurs to procure
23 business development assistance from certified entrepreneurial centers or to provide grants to
24 entrepreneurs working with an entrepreneurial center. The amount appropriated for
25 entrepreneurship grants in section 1 of this Act is not subject to section 54-44.1-11 and any
26 unexpended funds from this line item are available during the biennium beginning July 1, 2019,
27 and ending June 30, 2021.

28 **SECTION 13. ENERGY AND ENVIRONMENTAL RESEARCH CENTER GRANT -**
29 **MATCHING REQUIREMENT.** The grants line item in section 1 of this Act includes \$500,000
30 from the research North Dakota fund which the department of commerce shall provide as a
31 grant to the energy and environmental research center at the university of North Dakota. The

1 grant must be utilized for economic development and diversification of the North Dakota
2 economy and may be provided only to the extent the energy and environmental research center
3 provides one dollar of matching funds from private or other public sources for each one dollar
4 provided by the department for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019.

5 **SECTION 14. ESTIMATED INCOME - RESEARCH NORTH DAKOTA FUND.**

6 Notwithstanding section 54-65-08, the estimated income line item in section 1 of this Act
7 includes \$3,500,000 from the research North Dakota fund to the department of commerce for
8 department programs. Of this amount, \$500,000 is for the North Dakota tourism program,
9 \$1,000,000 is for discretionary funds, \$1,500,000 is for entrepreneurship grants and vouchers,
10 and \$500,000 is for providing a grant to the energy and environmental research center at the
11 university of North Dakota.

12 **SECTION 15. TRANSFER - RESEARCH NORTH DAKOTA FUND TO THE GENERAL**
13 **FUND.** Notwithstanding section 54-65-08, the office of management and budget shall transfer
14 \$4,000,000 from the research North Dakota fund to the general fund, during the biennium
15 beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019.

16 **SECTION 16. EMERGENCY.** Funding of ~~\$1,275,000~~\$950,000 in the operating expenses
17 line item in ~~section~~sections 1 and 7 of this Act, relating to the operation intern program, are
18 declared to be an emergency measure.
