The Senate convened at 1:00 p.m., with President Sanford presiding.

CORRECTION AND REVISION OF THE JOURNAL

FIRST READING OF HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 3034

A concurrent resolution urging North Dakota to continue strengthening and expanding sister-state ties between the state of North Dakota and the people of the Republic of China (Taiwan); supporting the signing of a Free Trade Agreement and Bilateral Investment Agreement between the United States and Taiwan; and reaffirming support for increasing Taiwan's international profile.

WHEREAS, the State of North Dakota and Taiwan entered a sister-state relationship in 1986; and

WHEREAS, Taiwan shares the same values of freedom, democracy, rule of law, and respect for human rights as the State of North Dakota; and

WHEREAS, the bonds of true friendship and mutually beneficial trade partnership between the State of North Dakota and Taiwan have been strengthened, resulting in strong economic, social, tourism, and cultural exchanges; and

WHEREAS, negotiations for a Bilateral Investment Agreement between Taiwan and the United States are an important step toward further strengthening bilateral trade and paving the way for a Free Trade Agreement between Taiwan and the United States, which will increase North Dakota's exports to Taiwan and promote bilateral investment; and

WHEREAS, Taiwan, as a responsible stakeholder in the international community, is seeking meaningful participation in the International Civil Aviation Organization, United

Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change, and International Criminal Police Organization;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

That the Sixty-fifth Legislative Assembly urges North Dakota to continue its endorsement and support of the relationship and shared interests between the people of the Republic of China (Taiwan) and the State of North Dakota and celebrate the thirty-first anniversary of sister-state relations; that the Sixty-fifth Legislative Assembly endorses the signing of the Bilateral Investment Agreement and Free Trade Agreement between Taiwan and the United States; and that the Sixty-fifth Legislative Assembly supports Taiwan's meaningful participation in international organizations that support the health, safety, and well-being of the people of Taiwan.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Secretary of State forward copies of this resolution to the United States Secretary of State, Secretary General of the International Civil Aviation Organization, United States Secretary of Transportation, Governor of the Taiwan Provincial Government, and Director General of the Taipei Economic and Cultural Office in Denver, Colorado.

**REMARKS OF LIEUTENANT COMMANDER JOEL HOLWITT
MARCH 14, 2017**

Lieutenant Governor Sanford; President Pro Tempore Lee; Majority Leader Wardner; Minority Leader Heckaman and Members of the Senate: I am Lieutenant Commander Joel Holwitt, Executive Officer of the USS North Dakota.

I bring you greetings from our Commanding Officer, Commander Michael P. Hollenbach and the entire crew of your submarine, USS NORTH DAKOTA. We are all very honored to serve on board USS NORTH DAKOTA and to be linked to such a wonderful state.

Presenting this report on the current status of your warship is a tremendous honor for myself and for my shipmates. Thank you for this incredible opportunity and experience.

This is my second opportunity to visit your wonderful state. Twenty years ago, I spent a terrific week in Fargo for a national high school classical language competition. Even though I grew up in Texas, the very first time I ever spent in a basement waiting out a tornado was that week in Fargo; it sure was a memorable experience! I could never have imagined that twenty years later I would serve aboard the most advanced submarine in the world, named for this great state.

On USS NORTH DAKOTA, we know we are very fortunate to have such dedicated and willing supporters from our namesake state. Your support as legislators, the tireless work of the people of North Dakota, and the continuing involvement of the USS NORTH DAKOTA Committee have truly shown that no other U.S. Navy ship has the terrific namesake state support that we do! Commander Hollenbach and our entire crew very much appreciate all you have done for us.

Only nine months after USS NORTH DAKOTA was commissioned in October 2014, the Navy picked your boat to undertake a special mission that no previous American submarine had performed. Deploying across the world to the United States European Command, USS NORTH DAKOTA proved the ability to employ unmanned undersea vehicles in practical scenarios and to execute incredibly complex undersea surveillance and mapping missions requiring coordination with multiple Naval Special Warfare units. With superior tactics and mission planning, NORTH DAKOTA conducted operations of extraordinary value to national security in a challenging undersea environment. Because your boat continually exceeded all operational requirements, demonstrating uncommon focus in operations and pioneering the employment of future capabilities in support of national objectives, the Secretary of the Navy awarded your boat a Meritorious Unit Commendation, an honor rarely earned by a submarine in the first year in commission.

Over the next few months, USS NORTH DAKOTA and our crew will execute a detailed test program for every weapons system in your boat in order to certify their readiness for combat. This is important not just for your boat, but for many other submarines that are incorporating NORTH DAKOTA's advanced systems. We will even live fire two Tomahawk missiles in the first ever test launch of the VIRGINIA Payload Tube Missile system. NORTH DAKOTA's two payload tubes, located in the bow of the submarine, are affectionately referred to as our "six shooters" because they hold six missiles each and are featured prominently on the submarine's crest. The rest of our testing will feature a large number of exercise torpedo shots, as well as an array of intelligence gathering and sonar missions in very challenging environments. Our crew is working tirelessly to execute these complex certifications and prepare for the boat's next deployment, currently scheduled for next year.

Through you and the great people of North Dakota, your boat will continue to draw strength from the soil. We will continue to cherish our strong connection to you and all the people of this wonderful state. Be assured that every Sailor who serves in USS NORTH DAKOTA for next 30 years will be inspired your continuing support and patriotism.
