- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 23-34-01 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to medical peer reviews.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 23-34-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is

5 amended and reenacted as follows:

6 **23-34-01**. **Definitions**.

- 8 1. "Health care organization" means:
- 9 a. A hospital;
- 10 b. A hospital medical staff;
- 11 c. A clinic;
- 12 d. A long-term or extended care facility;
- 13 e. An ambulatory surgery center;
- 14 f. An emergency medical services unit;
- 15 g. A physician;
- 16 h. A group of physicians operating a clinic or outpatient care facility;
- 17 i. A pharmacist;
- 18 j. A pharmacy;
- k. An association or organization, whether domestic or foreign, of medical
 institutions or medical professionals;
- A nonprofit corporation, whether domestic or foreign, that owns, operates, or is
 established by any entity set forth in subdivisions a through i;
- 23 m. Any combination of entities set forth in subdivisions a through j; or
- n. Any federally designated state peer review organization: or

3	2.	"Health care provider" means a physician or other personindividual licensed, certified,		
4		or otherwise authorized by the law of this state to provide health care services.

18			oral,	between:

27		functions it performs to monitor, evaluate, and take action to review the medical care		
28		provided to patients by health care organizations or health care providers and includes

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1	b.	Obtain and disseminate data and statistics relative to the treatment and
2		prevention of disease, illness, or injury;
3	C.	Develop and establish guidelines for medical care and the costs of medical care;
4	d.	Provide to other affiliated or nonaffiliated peer review organizations information
5		that is originally generated within the peer review organization for the purposes of
6		professional peer review;
7	e.	Identify or analyze trends in medical error, using among other things a
8		standardized incident reporting system; and
9	f.	Provide quality assurance.
