- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-09.1 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to audits of regional education associations; to amend and reenact
- 3 sections 15.1-01-03, 15.1-09.1-10, and 15.1-27-04.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating
- 4 to the powers and duties of the state board of public school education and the determination of
- 5 state aid payable to school districts and regional education associations; to provide statements
- 6 of legislative intent; and to provide for a legislative management study.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 8 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-01-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 10 15.1-01-03. State board of public school education Powers and duties.
- 1. The state board of public school education shall:
- 12 a. Assist county committees in carrying out their duties.
- b. Provide county committees with clerical assistance, plans of procedure,
- standards, data, maps, forms, and other materials, information, and services.
- 15 c. Appoint members to the county committee, if the county superintendent does not fulfill this duty, as provided for in section 15.1-10-01.
 - d. Provide oversight for regional education associations as required by chapter
 15.1-09.1.
 - 2. The state board of public school education may adopt rules regarding school district reorganizations, annexations, and dissolutions in accordance with chapter 28-32.
- SECTION 2. A new section to chapter 15.1-09.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

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1	Reg	ional education association - Audit.							
2	To be eligible for state funding, a regional education association must be audited, at least								
3	once every two years, by a certified public accountant or a licensed public accountant. The audit								
4	must be presented to the state board of public school education. If any irregularities are noted,								
5	the state board of public school education may direct the superintendent of public instruction to								
6	withhold all payments to a regional education association until the board determines the								
7	irregularities have been addressed.								
8	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-09.1-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is								
9	amende	amended and reenacted as follows:							
10	15.1	15.1-09.1-10. State aid - Payable to a regional education association - Obligation of

12	1.	The superintendent of public instruction shall forward the portion of a school district's							
13		state aid which is payable by the superintendent under subdivision I of subsection 1 of							
14		section 15.1-27-03.1 as a result of the district's participation in a regional education							
15		association directly to the association in which the district participates. The							
16		superintendent shall forward the amount payable under this subsectionsection at the							
17		same time and in the same manner as provided for other state aid payments under							
18		section 15.1-27-01, unless otherwise directed in accordance with section 2 of this Act.							
19	2.	If the superintendent of public instruction determines that a school district failed to-							
20		meet any contractual or statutory obligation imposed upon it as a result of the district's-							
21		participation in a regional education association, the superintendent shall subtract the							
22		amount for which the district was not eligible from any future distribution of state aid to-							
23		the district under section 15.1-27-01.

LEGISLATIVE INTENT REGIONAL EDUCATION ASSOCIATIONS.** It is the intent of the sixty-fifth legislative assembly that during the 2017-19 biennium regional education associations merge or partner with other regional education associations and other educational service providers, other regional education associations or other educational service providers, or both, to form the most most efficient and effective system of support for the schools in this state.
 - **SECTION 7. LEGISLATIVE INTENT TRANSPORTATION GRANTS.** It is the intent of the sixty-fifth legislative assembly that \$55,400,000 be included in the transportation grants line item in House Bill No. 1013, as approved by the sixty-fifth legislative assembly.
