- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-21 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to parental directives.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 15.1-21 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 6 Parental directive Administration of tests and assessments.
- 7 <u>1. The superintendent of public instruction shall respect and support the right of a parent</u>
 8 <u>to opt a child of the parent out of any survey or testing that is not a part of a</u>
- 9 <u>curriculum, to which the parent has a philosophical, moral, or religious objection.</u>
- 2. A student's parent may direct that the school district in which the student is enrolled
 not administer to the student any state test or state assessment required in
 accordance with section 15.1-21-08, 15.1-21-17, or 15.1-21-18.
- 3. A child withheld from a test or assessment under this section is deemed to be in
 attendance for all purposes under this title.
- 4. a. A parental directive is valid only if it is presented to the school district using a
 standardized form, prepared by the superintendent of public instruction, and
 signed by the student's custodial parent.
- b. A parental directive is valid only until the conclusion of the school year in which it
 is received by the school district.
- 20 c. A parental directive submitted to a school district in accordance with this section
 21 must be retained as part of the student's educational record.
- d. A school district is not liable for any consequences incurred by a student as a
 result of a parental directive submitted in accordance with this section.

1 A school district is not required to provide instruction or activities for a student 2 during the administration of any test or assessment referenced in the parental 3 directive submitted by the student's parent. 4 Each school district shall post the parental directive form on its website and make <u>f.</u> 5 the form available to a parent, upon request. 6 At the time and manner directed by the superintendent of public instruction, each g. 7 school district shall provide a report regarding the number of parental directives 8 received.
