- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide for the display of the prisoner of war and missing in action flag on
- 2 the state capitol grounds. for an Act to create and enact section 48-05-01.1 of the North Dakota
- 3 Century Code, relating to the display of the prisoner of war and missing in action flag on the
- 4 <u>state capitol grounds; and to declare an emergency.</u>

## 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6	— SECTION 1.
7	Display of prisoner of war and missing in action flag - State capitol.
8	The prisoner of war and missing in action flag must be flown daily on all outdoor,
9	permanent, flagpole locations on the state capitol grounds. The prisoner of war and missing in
10	action flag may be displayed on its own flagpole or under the flag of the United States.
11	SECTION 1. Section 48-05-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted
12	as follows:
13	48-05-01.1. Display of prisoner of war and missing in action flag - State capitol
14	grounds.
15	The prisoner of war and missing in action flag:
16	1. Must be flown daily on the state capitol grounds at the following flagpole locations:
17	a. Immediately south of the state capitol building;
18	b. In front of the all veterans memorial; and
19	c. On the east side of the heritage center.
20	2. May be flown either below the flag of the United States on the same flagpole or alone
21	on a separate flagpole.
22	3. Must be displayed using proper flag etiquette.
23	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY. This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
