1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 20.1-01-08 and 20.1-05-04 of the North

2 Dakota Century Code, relating to hunting predators at night with artificial light, digital night

3 vision, thermal vision, or infrared light.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 20.1-01-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is

6 amended and reenacted as follows:

- 7 20.1-01-08. Hunting with artificial light prohibited - Exception. 8 It is unlawful for an individual to pursue, shoot, kill, take, or attempt to take any wildlife 9 between sunset of one day and sunrise of the next, with the aid of a spotlight or any other 10 artificial light. This section does not make it unlawful for an except: 11 1. <u>An</u> individual<u>or the individual's agent tomay</u> use a lantern, spotlight, digital night. 12 vision, thermal vision, infrared light, or other artificial light to assist the personindividual 13 in pursuing and shooting on the person's individual's premises any covote, fox, skunk, 14 mink, raccoon, beaver, weasel, owl, rabbit, or other predatory animal or bird, attacking 15 and attempting to destroy the person's Individual's poultry, livestock, or other property-16 It is permissible to; and 17 2. An individual may use an artificial light, digital night vision, thermal vision, or infrared 18 light with a power source of not more than six volts while hunting afoot for covote, fox, 19 raccoon, or beaver during the open season on the animal. AThe artificial light must 20 produce a red, green, or amber filter must be placed on any artificial lightcolor when 21 used in the hunting of covote, fox, raccoon, or beaver, exceptincluding when taking a 22 raccoon treed or at bay.
- SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 20.1-05-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

2	No person, to hunt, pursue, kill, take, or attemptWhile hunting, pursuing, killing, taking, or	
3	attempting to take, or to aid in the hunting or taking of, any big game animal, an individual may	
4	<u>not</u> :	
5	1.	Use any animal except horses or mules.
6	2.	Use any artificial light, including spotlights and <u>a spotlight or</u> automobile and <u>or</u>
7		motorcycle headlightsheadlight.
8	3.	Engage in the practice commonly known as shining for deer. An individual who shines
9		anyan area commonly frequented by big game animals with any artificial light,
10		between the hours of sunset and sunrise, is in violation of this section. However, an
11		individual may use a flashlightan artificial light, night vision, thermal vision, or infrared
12		light with a power source of not overmore than six volts in the area while hunting afoot
13		to take <u>coyote, fox, raccoon,</u> or beaver.
