1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the public service 2 commission; to create and enact two new sections to chapter 49-01, subsection 4 of section 3 49-22-22, subsection 4 of section 49-22.1-21, and a new section to chapter 64-02 of the North 4 Dakota Century Code, relating to a public service commission program fund, a public utility 5 assessment, siting process administrative fees, and fees for registered service companies and 6 to license and test a registered service person; to amend and reenact sections 49-01-05, 7 57-43.2-19, 64-02-10, and 64-02-12 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the salary of 8 the commissioners, the transfer and distribution of funds in the highway tax distribution fund, 9 fees to test or calibrate weighing and measuring devices, and the deposit of fees; to provide a 10 report; and to provide for a transfer; and to declare an emergency.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the public service commission for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the public service commission, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023, as follows:

SIXTY-EIGHTH LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY. The following amounts reflect the one-time funding items approved by the sixty-sixth legislative assembly for the 2019-21 biennium and the 2021-23 one-time funding items included in the appropriation in section 1 of this Act:

The 2021-23 biennium one-time funding amounts are not a part of the entity's base budget for the 2023-25 biennium. The public service commission shall report to the appropriation committees of the sixty-eighth legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023.

SECTION 3. TRANSFER AND REPAYMENT - BEGINNING FARMER REVOLVING LOAN

FUND. The Bank of North Dakota shall transfer from the beginning farmer revolving loan fund to

1 the public service commission the sum of \$900,000, or so much of the sum as may be 2 necessary, included in the estimated income line item in section 1 of this Act to pay for costs 3 associated with a rail rate complaint case. Transfers must be made during the biennium 4 beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023, upon order of the commission. If any 5 amounts are spent pursuant to this section, the public service commission shall reimburse the 6 beginning farmer revolving loan fund using amounts available from damages or proceeds 7 received, net of legal fees, from a successful outcome of a rail complaint case. 8 SECTION 4. A new section to chapter 49-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 9 and enacted as follows: 10 Public service commission program fund - Transfer to general fund. 11 A special fund is established in the state treasury and designated as the public service 12 commission program fund. Moneys deposited in the fund may be spent by the public 13 service commission pursuant to legislative appropriation to defray the expenses of the 14 commission. 15 <u>2.</u> Revenue from the following sources must be deposited in the public service 16 commission program fund: 17 Any fees collected to test or calibrate weighing and measuring devices and <u>a.</u> 18 licensing of registered service companies and persons; 19 All money received from the public utility assessment; b. 20 All money received from the siting administrative fee; and <u>C.</u> 21 <u>d.</u> All interest and investment income earned on the balance of the fund. 22 The office of management and budget shall transfer any balance in the public service 3. 23 commission program fund that exceeds twice the amount of the current biennium's 24 appropriation one million one hundred thousand dollars to the general fund at the end 25 of each biennium. 26 SECTION 5. A new section to chapter 49-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 27 and enacted as follows: 28 Public utility fee. 29 The commission shall assess each electric and gas utility a fee in proportion to the 30 utility's respective gross operating revenues from the retail sale of gas and electric 31 service within the state during the preceding calendar year. The total public utility fee of

1		the combined assessments may not exceed two hundred twenty-five three hundred
2		thousand dollars per biennium. The fee must be paid quarterly and deposited in the
3		public service commission program fund.
4	<u>2.</u>	In January of each year, each electric and gas public utility shall file with the public
5		service commission the amount of gross receipts derived from the company's
6		customers within the state during the preceding calendar year. The commission shall
7		review the gross receipts annually and adjust the fee for each utility in proportion to
8		the gross operating revenues.
9	SEC	CTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 49-01-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is
10	amende	d and reenacted as follows:
11	49-0	01-05. Salary of commissioners.
12	The	annual salary of a commissioner is one hundred tenfifteen thousand eightthree
13	hundred	twenty-ninefour dollars through June 30, 2020202, and one hundred

15	charged	by any commissioner for any act or service rendered in any official capacity must be

19	and ena	cted as follows:
20	<u>4.</u>	Every applicant under this chapter shall pay to the commission an administrative fee
21		equal to one hundred dollars for each one million dollars of original investment, not to
22		exceed twenty-five thousand dollars. The administrative fee must be deposited in the
23		public service commission fund.
24	SEC	CTION 8. Subsection 4 of section 49-22.1-21 of the North Dakota Century Code is
25	created	and enacted as follows:
26	<u>4.</u>	Every applicant under this chapter shall pay to the commission an administrative fee
27		equal to one hundred dollars for each one million dollars of original investment, not to
28		exceed twenty-five thousand dollars. The administrative fee must be deposited into the
29		public service commission program fund.
30	SEC	CTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 57-43.2-19 of the North Dakota Century Code is
31	amende	d and reenacted as follows:

1 57-43.2-19. Transfer, deposit, and distribution of funds. (Effective through June 30, 2 20212025) 3 All taxes, license fees, penalties, and interest collected under this chapter must be 4 transferred to the state treasurer who shall deposit moneys in a highway tax distribution fund, 5 except all special fuels excise taxes collected on sales of diesel fuel to a railroad under section 6 57-43.2-03 of up to two hundred ninety-fourninety-sixninety-seven thousand fiveeightthree 7 hundred ninethirteen sixty-two dollars per year must be transferred to the state treasurer who 8 shall deposit the moneys in the rail safety fund. The highway tax distribution fund must be 9 distributed in the manner as prescribed by section 54-27-19. 10 Transfer, deposit, and distribution of funds. (Effective after June 30, 20212025) All 11 taxes, license fees, penalties, and interest collected under this chapter must be transferred to 12 the state treasurer who shall deposit moneys in the highway tax distribution fund. The highway 13 tax distribution fund must be distributed in the manner as prescribed by section 54-27-19. 14 **SECTION 10.** A new section to chapter 64-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 15 and enacted as follows: 16 Fees for registered service companies and to license and test a registered service 17 person. 18 <u>1.</u> Annually, each registered service company shall pay a registration fee of one hundred 19 dollars and a licensing fee of fifty dollars for each registered service person. 20 The commission may assess a registered service person testing fee not to exceed <u>2.</u> 21 twenty-five dollars per test. 22 SECTION 11. AMENDMENT. Section 64-02-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is 23 amended and reenacted as follows: 24 64-02-10. Fees to test or calibrate weighing and measuring devices. 25 The commission shall collect the following fees to: 26 Test overhead monorail, track, dormant, deck, and hanging scale of 1. 27 one thousand pounds [453 kilograms] or less capacity 53.0095.00 28 2. Test movable platform scale 11.0020.00 29 3. Test counter or computing scale 11.0020.00 30 4. Test hanging scale of fifty pound [22.68 kilogram] capacity or less 11.0020.00 31 5. 18	travel. If	f a test has been requested and the person requesting it fails to appear or to have the	ne	
19	weighing	g or measuring device ready for testing at the arranged time, there is a charge of te	n	
20	dollars a	a quarter hour for the time between the arranged time and the time at which the test	can	
21	begin.
