FIRST ENGROSSMENT with Senate Amendments ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1020

Introduced by

Appropriations Committee

1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the state water 2 commission; to create and enact a new section to chapter 61-02 and a new section to 3 chapter 61-40 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to reporting requirements for 4 carryover projects and bonding authority of the western area water supply; to amend and 5 reenact section 61-02-79 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the authorization of a 6 Bank of North Dakota line of credit; to provide for an exemption; to provide for a legislative 7 management study; to provide for a report to legislative management; to provide for a statement 8 of legislative intent; to provide for a pilot project; to provide for application; and to declare an

9 emergency.

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the state water commission for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the state water commission, for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act, and ending June 30, 2023, as follows:

11 SECTION 2. ONE-TIME FUNDING - EFFECT ON BASE BUDGET - REPORT TO THE

12 **SIXTY-EIGHTH LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY.** The following amounts reflect the one-time funding

13 items approved by the sixty-sixth legislative assembly for the 2019-21 biennium and the

14 2021-23 one-time funding items included in the appropriation in section 1 of this Act:

20 The 2021-23 biennium one-time funding amounts are not a part of the entity's base budget

21 for the 2023-25 biennium. The state water commission shall report to the appropriations

22 committees of the sixty-eighth legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the

biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023.

24 SECTION 3. ADDITIONAL INCOME - APPROPRIATION - BUDGET SECTION

25 **APPROVAL.** In addition to the amounts appropriated in section 1 of this Act, any additional

amounts in the resources trust fund which become available are appropriated, subject to budget

27 section approval, to the state water commission for the purpose of defraying the expenses of

that agency, for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act, and ending June 30,

29 2023. Before approving any request, the budget section shall determine:

Approving additional appropriations will not negatively affect the sixty-seventh

4	SEC		I 4. APPROPRIATION - RESOURCES TRUST FUND - STATE WATER	
5	COMMI	SSIO	N DISCRETIONARY FUNDING. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the	
6	resource	es tru	st fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$6,000,000, or	
7	so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the state water commission for the purpose of			
8	providing discretionary funds for water project grants, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021,			
9	and end	ing Ju	une 30, 2023. This funding is considered to be a one-time funding item.	
10	SEC		I 5. EXEMPTION - GRANTS - APPLICATION - WATER-RELATED PROJECTS -	
11	CARRY	OVEF	RAUTHORITY. Section 54-44.1-11 does not apply to funding of \$22,000,000 in the	
12	capital assets line item relating to state-owned projects and \$295,363,183 in the project			
13	carryover line item in section 1 of chapter 45 of the 2019 Session Laws. Any unspent funds from			
14	these ap	prop	riations may be continued into the 2021-23 biennium. Any funds continued may be	
15	expended only for the purpose for which it was originally appropriated. The state water			
16	commission may seek emergency commission and budget section approval under section			
17	54-16-04.2 to increase carryover spending authority of funds appropriated in the 2019-21			
18	biennium into the 2021-23 biennium.			
19	SECTION 6. A new section to chapter 61-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is created			
20	and enacted as follows:			
21	<u>Car</u>	ryove	r projects - Reporting requirements to the legislative management.	
22	<u>1.</u>	<u>The</u>	state water commission shall report quarterly to a legislative committee	
23	designated by the legislative management:			
24		<u>a.</u>	Each project the state water commission has designated as a carryover project	
25			that has had a cost-share agreement in place for at least four years;	
26		<u>b.</u>	The amount of funds still committed for each carryover project included in the	
27			report;	
28		<u>C.</u>	The total amount of funds reallocated or made available from carryover projects	
29			included in a previous report to other projects since the commission's preceding	
30			report; and	

1		d. The status of each carryover project for which the committee has made a		
2		recommendation under subsection 2 since the commission's preceding report.		
3	<u>2.</u>	The legislative committee designated by the legislative management to receive the		
4		state water commission's reports may make a recommendation to the state water		
5		commission that a carryover project included in a report be terminated under section		
6		61-02-14.3 and any funds remaining for the carryover project be reallocated and made		
7		available for projects with the same general purpose as the carryover project.		
8	SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 61-02-79 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
9	amended and reenacted as follows:			
10	0 61-02-79. Bank of North Dakota - Line of credit.			
11	The Bank of North Dakota shall extend a line of credit not to exceed seventy-five fifty million			
12	dollars at a rate of one and one-half percent over the three month London interbank offered			
13	rate, but may not exceed three percent to the state water commission. The state water			
14	commission shall repay the line of credit from funds available in the resources trust fund, water			
15	development trust fund, or other funds, as appropriated by the legislative assembly. The state			
16	water co	mmission may access the line of credit, as necessary, to provide funding as authorized		
17	by the legislative assembly for water supply projects approved before June 30, 2021, and flood			
18	control projects that have approval for funding beforethe northwest area water supply project			
19	during the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 20212023.			
20	SECTION 8. A new section to chapter 61-40 of the North Dakota Century Code is created			
21	and enacted as follows:			
22	Revenue bonds and bonds exempt from taxation.			
23	<u>1.</u>	The authority shall have the power and authority to issue revenue bonds, to include		
24		refunding bonds, for the purpose of financing construction of projects and incidental		
25		facilities authorized by this chapter. Revenue bonds issued under this section must be		
26		issued as provided in chapter 61-35, and are not subject to section 61-35-15.		
27	<u>2.</u>	Issuance of revenue bonds must be approved by a majority of the members of the		
28		board of directors of the authority.		
29	<u>3.</u>	The authority shall pledge sufficient revenue from any revenue-producing facility or		
30		other revenue sources, excluding industrial water sales, for the payment of principal		
31		and interest on the bonds and shall establish rates for the facilities at a sufficient level,		

1		together with any other available funds, to provide for the operation of the facilities and	
2		for the bond payments in the manner provided by section 61-40-11.	
3	<u>4.</u>	Revenue bonds may not be a general obligation of any participating member entity or	
4		the state and may not be secured by property taxes.	
5	<u>5.</u>	The revenue bonds may be issued and sold at public or private sale on the terms and	
6		conditions determined by the board of directors.	
7	<u>6.</u>	Bonds issued under this section and their income are exempt from taxation by the	
8		state.	
9	SEC	CTION 9. PILOT PROJECT - BASINWIDE WATER PLAN IMPLEMENTATION -	
10	REPOR	T TO LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT. Of the \$1,100,000 in the basinwide plan	
11	impleme	entation line item in section 1 of this Act, up to \$100,000 may be provided as a grant to	
12	reimbur	se water resource districts for costs incurred in the development of a basinwide water	
13	plan, and up to \$1,000,000 may be used to provide grants for the pilot project authorized in this		
14	section, for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act, and ending June 30, 2023.		
15	5 These funds are not subject to state water commission cost-share policies. Water resource		
16	districts and joint water resource districts in a basin may develop a basinwide water plan		
17	identifying water conveyance, flood control, and other water projects to be undertaken in the		
18	basin, and may jointly apply to the state water commission for a grant of up to \$1,000,000 for		
19	implementation of the plan. The state water commission may select a basinwide plan submitted		
20	under this section for funding and enter into one cooperative agreement with the water resource		
21	districts and joint water resource districts that submitted the plan. The cooperative agreement		
22	must inc	clude the amount of funding the state water commission will provide, a prohibition on	
23	using funds granted for implementation of the plan for planning or any purpose other than		
24	implementation of the basinwide plan, and the obligations of the state water commission and		
25	each water resource district and joint water resource district in implementing the basinwide		
26	plan. The agreement also must provide for monitoring and oversight of the basinwide plan's		
27	impleme	entation. The state water commission shall report to the legislative management on the	
28	results o	of this pilot project no later than August 1, 2022.	
29	SEC	CTION 10. STATE WATER COMMISSION - FARGO FLOOD CONTROL PROJECT	
30	FUNDIN	IG LIMIT - LEGISLATIVE INTENT. The state water commission may not approve state	
31	funding	for Fargo flood control projects, including constructing a federally authorized Fargo	

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1 flood control project, in excess of a total of \$850,000,000, which includes \$414,500,000

2 provided through June 30, 2021, without legislative approval. It is the intent of the sixty-seventh

3 legislative assembly that the remaining \$435,500,000 is provided from bond proceeds during

4 the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023.

5 SECTION 11. STATE WATER COMMISSION - MOUSE RIVER FLOOD CONTROL

6 **PROJECT FUNDING - LEGISLATIVE INTENT.** Excluding the funding provided for Mouse River

7 flood control projects prior to the 2021-23 biennium, the state water commission may not

8 approve state funding for the Mouse River flood control project in excess of a total of

9 \$604,000,000 without legislative approval. It is the intent of the sixty-seventh legislative

10 assembly that of the \$604,000,000, \$74,500,000 is provided from the resources trust fund

11 through bond proceeds used to repay outstanding loans of the resources trust fund during the

12 biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023.

SECTION 12. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - RURAL WATER SUPPLY. It is the intent of the sixty-seventh legislative assembly that, in addition to any funds approved for the project by the state water commission in previous bienniums, up to \$1,600,000 of the funding appropriated in the rural water supply - grants line item be made available during the 2021-23 biennium to the system 4 connection to system 1 rural water supply project sponsored by all seasons water district.

19 SECTION 13. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - RED RIVER VALLEY WATER

SUPPLY MANAGEMENT STUDY - REPORT TO LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT. During the 2021-22 interim, the legislative management, with input from the state water commission and from stakeholders of the Red River valley water supply project, shall consider studying the management and operation of the Red River valley water supply project. The study must include consideration of the appropriate entity to own, manage, and operate the project. The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-eighth legislative assembly.

SECTION 14. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - NORTHWEST AREA WATER

SUPPLY. During the 2021-23 interim, the legislative management with input from the state water commission shall consider studying the northwest area water supply project. The study must include consideration of an entity, other than the state, to own, manage, and operate the project. The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, together

- 1 with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-eighth legislative
- 2 assembly.
- 3 **SECTION 15. EMERGENCY.** This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
