1	A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15.1-27-04.1 of the North Dakota Century						
2	Code, relating to the education foundation aid funding formula and the treatment of federal						
3	impact aid funding.						
4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:						
5	SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-27-04.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is						
6	amended and reenacted as follows:						
7	15.1-27-04.1. Baseline funding - Establishment - Determination of state aid. (Effective						
8	through June 30, 2025)						
9	1. To determine the amount of state aid payable to each district, the superintendent of						
10	public instruction shall establish each district's baseline funding. A district's baseline						
11	funding consists of:						
12	a. All state aid received by the district in accordance with chapter 15.1-27 during the						
13	2018-19 school year;						
14	b. An amount equal to the property tax deducted by the superintendent of public						
15	instruction to determine the 2018-19 state aid payment;						
16	c. An amount equal to seventy-five percent of the revenue received by the school						
17	district during the 2017-18 school year for the following revenue types:						
18	(1) Revenue reported under code 2000 of the North Dakota school district						
19	financial accounting and reporting manual, as developed by the						
20	superintendent of public instruction in accordance with section 15.1-02-08;						
21	(2) Mineral revenue received by the school district through direct allocation from						
22	the state treasurer and not reported under code 2000 of the North Dakota						

school district financial accounting and reporting manual, as developed by

1			the superintendent of public instruction in accordance with section
2			15.1-02-08;
3		(3)	Tuition reported under code 1300 of the North Dakota school district
4			financial accounting and reporting manual, as developed by the

6			with the exception of revenue received specifically for the operation of an
7			educational program provided at a residential treatment facility and, tuition
8			received for the provision of an adult farm management program, and
9			beginning in the 2021-22 school year, seventeen percent of tuition received
10			under an agreement to educate students from a nonoperating school district
11			on an air force base with funding received through federal impact aid, and
12			an additional seventeen percent of tuition received under an agreement to
13			educate students from a nonoperating school district on an air force base
14			with funding received through federal impact aid each school year
15			thereafter, until the 2024-25 school year when sixty-eight percent of tuition
16			received under an agreement to educate students from a nonoperating
17			school district on an air force base with funding received through federal
18			impact aid must be excluded from the tuition calculation under this
19			paragraph;
20		(4)	Revenue from payments in lieu of taxes on the distribution and transmission
21			of electric power;
22		(5)	Revenue from payments in lieu of taxes on electricity generated from
23			sources other than coal; and
24		(6)	Revenue from the leasing of land acquired by the United States for which
25			compensation is allocated to the state under 33 U.S.C. 701(c)(3); and
26	d.	An a	amount equal to the total revenue received by the school district during the
27		201	7-18 school year for the following revenue types:
28		(1)	Mobile home tax revenue;
29		(2)	Telecommunications tax revenue; and
30		(3)	Revenue from payments in lieu of taxes and state reimbursement of the
31			homestead credit and disabled veterans credit; and

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- 1 Beginning with the 2020-21 school year, the superintendent shall reduce the 2 baseline funding for any school district that becomes an elementary district 3 pursuant to section 15.1-07-27 after the 2012-13 school year. The reduction must 4 be proportional to the number of weighted student units in the grades that are 5 offered through another school district relative to the total number of weighted 6 student units the school district offered in the year before the school district 7 became an elementary district. The reduced baseline funding applies to the 8 calculation of state aid for the first school year in which the school district 9 becomes an elementary district and for each year thereafter. For districts that 10 become an elementary district prior to the 2020-21 school year, the 11 superintendent shall use the reduced baseline funding to calculate state aid for 12 the 2020-21 school year and for each year thereafter.
  - a. The superintendent shall divide the district's baseline funding determined in subsection 1 by the district's 2017-18 weighted student units to determine the district's baseline funding per weighted student unit.
    - b. For any school district that becomes an elementary district pursuant to section 15.1-07-27 after the 2017-18 school year, the superintendent shall adjust the district's baseline funding per weighted student unit used to calculate state aid. The superintendent shall divide the district's baseline funding determined in subsection 1 by the district's weighted student units after the school district becomes an elementary district to determine the district's adjusted baseline funding per weighted student unit. The superintendent shall use the district's adjusted baseline funding per weighted student unit in the calculation of state aid for the first school year in which the school district becomes an elementary district and for each year thereafter.
    - c. Beginning with the 2021-22 school year and for each school year thereafter, the superintendent shall reduce the district's baseline funding per weighted student unit. Each year the superintendent shall calculate the amount by which the district's baseline funding per weighted student unit exceeds the payment per weighted student unit provided in subsection 3. The superintendent shall reduce the district's baseline funding per weighted student unit by fifteen percent of the

For districts that 22 become an elementary district prior to the 2020-21 school year, the 23 superintendent shall use the reduced baseline funding to calculate state aid for 24 the 2020-21 school year and for each year thereafter. 25 2. a. The superintendent shall divide the district's baseline funding determined in 26 subsection 1 by the district's 2017-18 weighted student units to determine the 27 district's baseline funding per weighted student unit. 28 b. For any school district that becomes an elementary district pursuant to section 29 15.1-07-27 after the 2017-18 school year, the superintendent shall adjust the 30 district's baseline funding per weighted student unit used to calculate state aid. 31 The superintendent shall divide the district's baseline funding determined in

1 subsection 1 by the district's weighted student units after the school district 2 becomes an elementary district to determine the district's adjusted baseline 3 funding per weighted student unit.
