- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 29-29 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to prohibiting entry onto private property without permission.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 29-29 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 6 <u>Law enforcement entry onto private property for search and seizure without</u>
- 7 permission prohibited Exception.
- 8 <u>1. As used in this section, "law enforcement officer" has the meaning provided in section</u> 9 12.1-01-04.
- 10 2. Notwithstanding any other provision of law and subject to subsection 3, a law
- 11 <u>enforcement officer may not enter private property for search and seizure unless the</u>
- 12 <u>law enforcement officer receives permission from the owner or a lessee of the</u>
- 13 property.
- 14 3. A law enforcement officer may enter private property without permission if:
- 15 <u>a. Probable cause exists that a violation of law has occurred, is occurring, or is</u>
 16 <u>about to occur;</u>
- b. A search warrant has been issued;
- 18 <u>c.</u> Responding to an emergency situation, accident, or other threat to public safety;

 19 <u>or</u>
- d. Fulfilling a lawful exercise of duties.
