A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 43-51-07 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the powers of occupational boards under occupational compacts; to repeal chapters 43-12.4, 43-12.5, 43-17.4, and 43-26.2 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the nurse licensure compact, advanced practice registered nurse licensure compact, interstate medical licensure compact, and physical therapy licensure compact; and to provide a contingent effective date for an Act to provide for a legislative management study of occupational boards that address mental health and behavioral health.

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 43-51-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is

License compacts. 12 A board may establish, by administrative rule, conditions and procedures for foreign-13 practitioners to practice in this state pursuant to written compacts or agreements 14 between the board and one or more other states or jurisdictions or pursuant to any 15 other method of license recognition that ensures the health, safety, and welfare of the 16 public. Any compact or agreement by a board does not become binding on this state-17 until implemented by administrative rules under this section. 18 If a board or the legislative assembly enters a compact affecting the qualifications of a 19 foreign practitioner: 20 The relevant board shall monitor the rules adopted under the compact to ensure

the rules are consistent with the compact and sufficiently protect the health and

safety of the residents of this state, including whether the licensure of foreign

practitioners adequately considers factors such as education, experience, and

disciplinary status.

licensure compact rules are clearly inconsistent with the compact or do not sufficiently protect the health and safety of the residents of this state.

RELATING TO MENTAL HEALTH AND BEHAVIORAL HEALTH. During the 2021-22 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying the occupational boards that address mental health and behavioral health issues which may include the state board of psychologist examiners, board of addiction counseling examiners, board of counselor examiners, education standards and practices board, North Dakota board of social work examiners, and North Dakota marriage and family therapy licensure board. The study must include a review of the rules adopted by the boards and consideration of the frequency with which the rules are reviewed, whether there are barriers to practice and barriers to admission of foreign practitioners, and whether there is adequate training for board members and executive directors of these boards. The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-eighth legislative assembly.
