## **SENATE BILL NO. 2068**

- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new subsection to section 44-11-02 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to payment of fees and costs for removal of an official for an Act to
- 3 amend and reenact subsection 5 of section 44-11-02 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 4 relating to the obligations to prosecute the removal of an official.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. A new subsection to section 44-11-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

All costs, including attorney's fees charged by the prosecuting attorney and fees charged by an appointed special commissioner, resulting from the prosecution of the removal proceedings must be paid by the county, political subdivision, or district in which the individual charged is an officer.

**SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 5 of section 44-11-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

- 5. Upon receipt of the recommendation of the attorney general, the governor shall determine whether to proceed with the appointment of a special commissioner. If the governor decides not to appoint a special commissioner, the governor shall notify the individuals who filed the petition and summarize the reasons for the decision. If the governor decides to appoint a special commissioner, the governor shall request that a prosecutor draft and serve the official complaint against the officer.
  - a. When the officer sought to be removed is other than the state's attorney, the state's attorney or other competent attorney, upon request of the governor, for the county involved or in which the political subdivision or office is located, upon request of the governor, shall appear and prosecute. Upon approval of the

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- governor, the state's attorney may contract with a state's attorney from another county or other competent attorney.
- b. When the proceedings are brought to remove the state's attorney, the governor shall request the attorney general or other competent attorney to shall appear on behalf of the state and prosecute such proceedings. Upon approval of the governor, the attorney general may contract with a state's attorney or other competent attorney.
