

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Pinellas County, FL Master Plan

- Multi-facility campus
- 2,354 existing beds
- Males & females
- Three phase master plan
 - Phase A:
 - ∞ 2,500 beds
 - Food service/laundry
 - Infrastructure
 - Phase B:

 - Cell House demolitions
 - Phase C:
 - ∞ 1,250 beds
 - Cell house demolitions
 - Additional parking



- Previously: Space, staff, operational program/cost estimates for:
 - 798 bed intake center/honor housing (50,000 intakes/year)
 - 428 bed Health Care Facility



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Mecklenburg Co, NC Master Plan

- Update of 1990 Master Plan
- All facilities built from old M.P.
 - ◆ 1900 beds pretrial (downtown)
 - ◆ 600 bed sentenced (remote)
 - 150 bed work release (downtown)
- Programming for all facilities
- House Federal Marshall inmates
- House federal ICE inmates
- New M.P.: <u>7,600</u> beds, 2030
- Fourth site being studied
- Space needs, inmate classification, and cost-benefit studied.
- Transition & Staff training provided.
- <u>Innovation</u>: "Dry" single cells in direct supervision setting



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Waukesha Co, WI Master Plan

- Master Plan for multi-phased additionrenovation project
- Phase 1:
 - 252 bed addition
 - Special needs, maximum custody
 - New video visiting center
 - New clinic and health care pod
 - Road re-routing, parking
 - ◆ \$500 K Utility re-location
- Phase 2:
 - Secure courts tower
 - Secure court holding
 - 8 courtrooms
- Phase 3:
 - ♦ 224 beds
 - Direct supervision housing





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St. Charles Co, MO Renovation

- Expansion of existing 324 bed facility.
- Added 134 beds into previously unsecured office space
- Medium-maximum security beds
- Custom designed steel cell modules
- Food service and program support expansion
- Master plan for 400 additional beds











Evaluation Mission

- New facility at State Penitentiary Site,
- New facility at another Bismarck area site, <u>or</u>
- Remodeling of existing Penitentiary.
- All for a 900 to 1000 inmate population
 - ◆ Male inmates
 - ♦80% maximum, 20% medium







Major Planning Issues

- Inmate Classification & Separation.
 - Especially special needs: health, age, security
 - Identify disparate growth rates
- Housing Supervision/Surveillance approach.
- Occupancy Type.
- Staff and cost efficiency
- Source & nature of basic services.
- Education and Rehabilitation
- Type & extent of programs & support.
- Flexibility & Expandability



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Process (with Users/Owners)

- Understand previous work; integrate
- Understand facility(ies)
- Define problems
- Understand mission, goals, future
- Generate concepts
- Evaluate in detail:
 - ◆ The Qualitative: Pros/cons
 - ◆ The Quantitative: Life Cycle costs
- Recommend a Supportable Plan







Primary Products

- Master Plan
- Preliminary design & staffing plan
- Cost-benefit analysis
 - Existing compared to proposed concepts
 - ◆ Staff, operations, physical plant
- Project cost estimate
