

Sen. Carlisle, members of the commission: Thank you for the opportunity to address the Alternatives to Corrections Commission. I was privileged to serve on the commission and have great respect for the work you are doing.

I have thoughts I'd like to share with you, and while they may seem disjointed, I think they may be helpful to you as you consider sentencing practices.

The first thing I need to tell you is that I think **members of the public would be shocked** if they knew just how many convictions a criminal defendant has before being sentenced to the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation.

Judges are elected and part of their job is sentencing of criminal defendants. Sentencing goals are discussed a great deal. They include rehabilitation of criminal defendants, restitution for crime victims, punishment, protection of the community, and deterrence. As a judge, I have to consider each case individually. I look at the nature of the offense, the background and criminal record of the defendant, recommendations from the prosecution and defense, the defendant's statements at sentencing, a crime victim impact statement.

I have a couple case studies which might be helpful in this discussion.

On January 7, I handled a sentencing for a man who was charged with possession of drug paraphernalia – a class C felony. The offense occurred in 2013. The criminal information alleged the defendant had drug paraphernalia and

used or intended to use it with methamphetamine. It was alleged the paraphernalia included hypodermic needles, metal spoons, a glass smoking device, and a digital scale all with residue of methamphetamine. Class C felonies are punishable by a maximum term of imprisonment of five years, a \$10,000 fine, and a court fees of at least \$500.

The defendant's record included a criminal trespass conviction from 2009 – a class A misdemeanor. He'd been sentenced to a year in the county jail, which was suspended. He was on unsupervised probation and required to pay \$325 in fees.

He'd been convicted of burglary, a class B felony, in 2009. As part of the same case, he had been charged with terrorizing. That charge was dismissed, but he pled guilty to assault and possession of alcohol by a person under 20. In April, 2009, he was sentenced to two years of supervised probation. He was required to have a chemical dependency evaluation and complete recommended treatment. In October, 2009, his probation was revoked, apparently because he hadn't followed through with treatment, and he was re-sentenced to a probationary sentence. The probation was terminated early at the request of the defendant and probation officer in June of 2011.

For the 2013 drug paraphernalia case, I sentenced the defendant to five years with the Department of Corrections. All but 60 days was suspended for three years, and the defendant was placed on supervised probation with a

requirement that he again have a chemical addiction evaluation and treatment. The 60 days were served in the Morton County Detention Center.

On November 4, I sentenced a man who had been convicted of Possession of Methamphetamine with Intent to Deliver, a class A felony, and possession of drug paraphernalia, a class A misdemeanor. The jury had returned guilty verdicts on July 17, 2013. A pre-sentence investigation was ordered, and was filed with the Court on September 19. Sentencing was set for October 1, but was rescheduled at the request of defense counsel, and was held on November 4.

The pre-sentence investigation indicated there had been convictions for giving false information to a peace officer in 2007, for petty theft in 2007, for criminal mischief and theft of property in 2008. There were three convictions for driving without liability insurance in 2012 and 2013.

The pre-sentence writer noted that the defendant had been in custody since July 17, 2013. It was determined that the defendant had a moderate to high risk with a 58 per cent chance of recidivism. The pre-sentence writer recommended the defendant be sentenced to eight years with the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation, with all but 18 months suspended for three years after release. A chemical dependency evaluation had been completed and it was recommended the defendant receive intensive outpatient level treatment.

The actual sentence was a sentence of five years at the DOCR, with all but 18 months suspended, to be followed by three years of supervised probation. The defendant was to receive credit for 128 days already served, and I recommended placement at the Tompkins Rehabilitation and Corrections Center. I required the defendant receive treatment while incarcerated. (The drug paraphernalia sentence is to run concurrently with the deliver sentence.)

While it would be nice to have some neat way to compare sentences, real life doesn't work that way. A discussion of sentencing practices needs to include more parties than just judges. As judges, we work in a community where decisions to make arrests and investigate offenses are made by law enforcement officers. Charging decisions are made by prosecutors including the elected State's Attorneys. We listen to sentencing recommendations from prosecutors and defense counsel, and consider plea agreements they propose.

Trial Court Administrator Donna Wunderlich has worked with numbers provided by the Department of Corrections, and has an interesting analysis of case filings. You may want to invite her to a future meeting. She would have been with me today, but is at an educational session out-of-state.

In fact, if you look at all offenses, and not just the indexed offenses,

Burleigh County has a higher rate of criminal charges filed per capita than does Cass County. The filings per capita in Burleigh County were 3.5 per cent in 2012 and 3.4 per cent in 2013. In Cass County, the per capita filings were 2.5 per cent in 2012 and 2.2 percent in 2013.

In Burleigh County, requests for revocation of probation were 14.2 per cent of the case filings in 2012, and 16 per cent of the case filings in 2013. In Cass County, requests for revocation of probation were 10.6 per cent of the criminal filings in 2012 and 11.6 of the filings in 2013.

If the Burleigh County filings reflected a 2.2 per cent filing rate in 2013 (the rate in Cass County), we would have had more than 1,000 fewer criminal cases filed. If petitions for revocation of probation were filed at the Cass County rate, we would have had about 250 fewer petitions for revocation.

Obviously, we don't have any control over the number of cases filed. We don't have the ability to decide our budget is depleted, and we won't file any more criminal cases.

But, it is still a fact that there are more inmates at the Department of Corrections from Burleigh County, and they appear to be sentenced for longer

periods.

One difference between Burleigh County and Cass County is that we order a greater number of presentence investigations. We understand that is a practice preferred by the Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation. When we started to hear from legislators that the judges in our district were being criticized for sentencing too many inmates to the State Penitentiary, we did a study of the cases in which presentence investigations were ordered in 2012, and how the sentencing of defendants who were the subject of those investigations compared to the sentences recommended by the writers of the presentence investigations.

Interestingly, after reviewing more than 160 case files, we learned there were only a very few cases in which the judge sentenced to more penitentiary time than recommended by the presentence writer. In some case, it appears there was a requirement to serve time, but in that was because a defendant received credit for time served prior to sentencing. In a couple cases it might appear there was more time imposed than was recommended, but a more careful review demonstrates that the net sentence was the same as recommended. I'm providing a copy of our review to your committee.

In one case, a class AA felony charge of delivery of a controlled substance,

Judge Schneider imposed an eight-year sentence rather than the five-year sentence recommended by the presentence writer. Judge Schneider had handled a jury trial. The prosecutor recommended the eight-year sentence. It was noted that the defendant had been through treatment programs seven times, and that the defendant may be considered for early release through the parole process. Other cases where sentences were longer than recommended involved gross sexual imposition and continuous sexual abuse of a child.

We've taken a look at sentencing in the South Central Judicial District from April 1 - 15, 2014. We had 82 cases in which defendants were sentenced. There were 77 individual defendants, and 103 counts or charges involved. There were 48 sentences to the Department of Corrections. The Department of Corrections sentences involved 29 individual defendants. For 20 of the criminal counts, there was no jail or prison time imposed. For four counts, the sentence was served at the Burleigh County Detention Center.

13 individual defendants were sentenced to the State Penitentiary on 24 criminal counts. Of those 13:

- 3 were already incarcerated and were sentenced to concurrent time.
- 3 were sentenced on revocation of probation.
- 1 was a revocation, and the sentence will run concurrent with a Stutsman County case.

- 1 was a 4th Driving Under the Influence with a mandatory prison sentence.
- 1 was an inmate who walked away from the Bismarck Transition Center while on pretrial status.
- 4 were felony drug cases.

Let's look at one of those felony drug cases. On April 3, 2014, Judge Jorgensen sentenced a defendant charged with Possession of Methamphetamine with Intent to Deliver. The defendant was sentenced to 10 years at the Department of Corrections. The presentence investigation indicates:

Defendant has been extradited for various violations multiple times through North Dakota and California. Defendant was incarcerated at NDSP starting July 2002. He was paroled on January 6, 2003, however violated parole and was sent to NDSP of March 5, 2003 where he remained until his sentence expired on April 29, 2003. Defendant was received to NDSP on a new sentence starting May 5, 2006, and remained incarcerated until his parole on March 19, 2012 to BTC. . .

Defendant violated his parole on at least four occasions in California.

Because the defendant would not cooperate with the presentence investigator, no recommendation was made.

At this point, many of the sentencing discussions are driven by consideration of the cost of incarceration and probation services. Because of the way agencies are funded, there is a desire to protect the budget of one agency by shifting costs to another. The Department of Corrections would prefer more

defendants be sentenced to county detention centers, shifting the cost from the State to the counties. Although it's been suggested that judges are somehow aligned with the county sheriffs in an effort to move incarceration from the county jails to the state penitentiary, I can tell you that in 27 years, I've never heard such a suggestion from anyone involved with a county detention center.

And, it's not just a shifting of costs from one governmental unit to another. There's always a tension between those tasked with providing mental health services and those tasked with probation and incarceration. Somehow, the budgeting process needs to get to a point where it recognizes the same taxpayers are funding the county resources and the state resources; the corrections system and the mental health treatment system.

I know it's been suggested that many of those sentenced to the State Penitentiary just need treatment. I agree there is a great need for treatment, and treatment works. But, when you have an individual who has had a number of opportunities for treatment, and there are ongoing issues with addiction, that treatment must be accomplished in a secure setting, and there must be an enforced period of sobriety.

And, I'll wrap up with comments about the resources available for sentencing. I know that there is a waiting list for people in need of treatment for chemical addiction and other mental health disorders at West Central Human Services. Delays in receiving treatment make treatment more difficult and less

likely to be successful. Even if people have resources and the ability to pay for treatment, there are waiting lists at local treatment facilities. As judges, we would welcome addition resources. If they were available, we could better tailor sentences to meet all our sentencing goals.

And, the judges in Burleigh and Morton Counties and Cass County have much great access to resources than do judges in more rural areas. Treatment might be necessary, it might allow for alternatives to incarceration, but if it isn't available for practical purposes, we don't have alternative.





