ERGO Initiative and ERGO Grant Program

Approximately 35% of all claims filed can be traced back to poor ergonomics. What typically begins as minor aches and pains, if ignored, has potential to develop into costly claims. This proactive program offers employers financial assistance to help in reducing or eliminating cumulative-type injuries at the workplace. Over \$13.7 million has been awarded through the Ergo Program through May 31, 2016.


