

I did speak with James Burgum and he also believes the correct numbers weren't reported, these are very difficult to collect as people don't usually publicize investments or private placements.


What time is testimony on the 26th... James Burgum or I will not be attending, but may have our current fund chairs with active investments speak from Harvest Fund (Emily O'Brien) and from the 701 Fund (Greg Syrup)

The intent of the funds, and the return on investment for in state investors are off track, we did send in new language, but I don't believe it is what the legislators liked the revisions. Angel funds invest with expectations to invest in deals that have the highest odds of getting a return. The state of North Dakota is invested in many of these funds through the Bank of ND and Dev Fund as well.

When the angel funds have a successful return the North Dakota investors are paying taxes on that income. (no matter what state the investments are made).

Please me know what time on the 26th so if I can get Emily and Greg to testify they can be in Bismarck.
