**Chairman Traynor and members of the Committee: My name is Karen Romig Larson, Director of the Division of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services in the ND Department of Human Services. I am here today to offer comments on SCR 4018 as it pertains to the study of the commitment law.**

**I am in full support of a formal study of NDCC Chapter 25-03.1, the mental health commitment law. There have been numerous changes in North Dakota in the past several years. Changes in clinical practices and in service delivery systems for persons with mental illnesses and/or substance abuse definitely require an examination of the current law. It should also be noted that a number of other states have closed down all of their state hospitals and/or drastically changed their mental health commitment laws. I believe a careful study of other states' experiences can only be beneficial to this effort.**

**I do believe with the number of agencies, systems and stakeholders involved and interested in the mental health commitment, it is imperative to have a study group which is representative of all of them. Advocates, consumers of mental health and/or substance abuse services, the Division of Mental Health and Substance Abuse, the Attorney General's office, both public and private providers, the judiciary, law enforcement, defense and states attorneys are among the groups which should be involved in the effort.**

I would also request that, in consideration of this study resolution, and in future consideration of SCR 4033, the Committee consider combining the two resolution into one study effort, and call for the formation of subcommittees to examine particular aspects of the statute, such as is identified in SCR 4018. This will assure consistency in effort and will likely enhance the ability for multiple stakeholders to reach consensus on recommending changes to the law.

Thank you very much for the opportunity to address this important issue this morning. I would be pleased to respond to any questions you may have.

**Testimony on SCR 4018**  
**Presented by Attorney General Wayne Stenehjem**

The final component of my program deals with the study of treatment and commitment laws dealing with controlled substance abusers. We need to take an in-depth look at our chemical dependency commitment laws to determine if new standards are needed to deal with the treatment of those addicted to methamphetamine. The effects of addiction to this substance are different than nearly any other substance, and our commitment statute must keep abreast of the reality of this substance. I am proposing this interim study to consider what changes must be made to these laws, as well as a study of the effectiveness of current sentencing statutes. We need to determine whether our minimum mandatory sentencing laws, and other approaches are working or whether different approaches might better meet the needs of our citizens. Again, I am asking for a do-pass.

## Chapter 1: (How to make acid)

-Method 1- (I would sell this, not take it myself)

How to make inexpensive (K-mart brand) acid at home:

All the items needed to make this wonder drug, can be found at most grocery stores even K-mart for that matter.

## Items needed:

1. Get a jar of Ragu or some cheap pasta sauce. Just make sure that the jar is glass. You can even use an empty baby food jar.
2. Get about five to six packs of chewing gum. The big packs and make sure to get type of gum with the tin foil like wrappers.
3. Get a lighter or some matches. Or if you're under aged to buy a lighter, get one of those fire place or barbecue pit lighters.
4. Get a pack of razors. You only need one, but they only sell in packs.
5. Get a pack of nine-volt batteries or any kind of battery for that matter.
6. Get a bottle of rubbing alcohol, make sure it is isopropyl alcohol.
7. Somehow get a nail and a hammer.
8. Get a bottle of some kind of herbal supplements like ginger or kava kava. Make sure the supplements are in pill capsules that can be taken apart.

## How to make the acid with the items you got:

1. Empty the bottle of pasta sauce or eat it. Save the lid. Make sure the bottle is clean inside.
2. Throw away or chew all the gum. Save the wrappers.
3. Hold the bottle upside down and burn all the gum wrappers under it. Allowing the black smoke to go in the bottle.
4. You should see a black film of resin inside the bottle. Break the bottle and use one of the razor blades to scrap the resin out. Put all the resin into the lid of the pasta sauce bottle.
5. Pour the rubbing alcohol in the lid. Little at a time, where the resin turns into slime. Where it's not a liquid and not a solid. Try to make it more solid, then liquid.
6. Using the nail and hammer break holes in the nine volts, allowing the battery acid inside to somewhat drip out. Put the battery acid in the lid with the slime resin. About the same amount as the rubbing alcohol, should go in. The slime should still be somewhat of a solid but yet also a liquid.
7. Allow it to dry out. Then scrap the black resin out of the lid. Put the resin into capsules. You can get the capsules from the herbal supplements, just pull the pills apart and take the herbal powder out. You should take small amounts of this acid first to see how strong it is. Then base the amount of one hit on that.
8. If you want you can put some food coloring in it to make it look better. Then you can call your acid Purple Voodoo Magic or Orange Paradise. Enjoy!

-----How does all this make acid?-----

Well, good question. You got four main factors: the electrolyte and sulfuric acid in the batteries, the iso-propyl from the rubbing alcohol, and the magic T 2 Toxin in the gum

wrapper resin.

Well, the sulfuric acid is a heavy corrosive oily dibasic strong acid, which breaks down the electrolyte making it a strong ionic solvent. Then this solvent is mixed with the iso propyl. Propyl is a two isomeric alkyl radical and is in the methyl family. When the strong make-shift ionic solvent is mixed with the propyl the alkyl is taken from the isomeric radical and is now a free base alkylate. Now the alkylate is not a yet. Now it must be mixed with the T 2 Toxin. The T 2 Toxin is deadly in high doses, but has hallucinogen effects. So to make a small non-deadly amount of T 2 Toxin high potency, we mix it with the alkylate, forming a tight bond and making a hallucinogen alkyl powder when dry. The powder is put in to dose amount capsules and taken.

Method 2 (This is the good recipe, very pure)

Making LSD (LySorgic acid Diethylamide):

Items needed:

1. About 200 grams of MORNING GLORY SEEDS.
2. 200 cc. of petroleum ether (make sure it's PETROLEUM ether)
3. Small piece of window screen or strainer.
4. A couple of large glasses.
5. One old cookie tray.
6. 260 cc. of wood alcohol.

What to do:

1. Grind up about 170 grams of seeds. (Wash the seeds in water first)
2. In 145 cc. of petroleum ether, soak the seeds for two to three days.
3. With screen, filter the liquid and save the seed mush. Allow the mush to dry.
4. Let the mush soak in 130 cc. of wood alcohol for two days.
5. Filter the solution again. Save the liquid in a glass jar.
6. Soak the same mush again in another 130 cc. of wood alcohol for two more days.
7. Filter out the mush and throw it away. Save the liquid.
8. Now, pour both saved glass containers with the liquid in them, into a cookie sheet.
9. Let the liquid dry in to a yellowish gum.

Scrap the yellow gum into pill capsules and take. Sample it first to see how much one hit is.

OR

If your not going to sell or store it I would recommend that you make a one-hitter. This is made by washing the seeds with cold water and soap. Then letting them dry a bit. Second, take all of the seeds (13.5g) and put them into a balloon. Take a hammer and crushed the hell out of them. Then put all of the crushed seeds in a cup filled with about 8oz of COLD water. Then swish them around a lot and let them sit for about 45 mins. Third, drink the water and mix the mushy leftover seed pulp with food like yogurt and eat it.

This will make you trip balls just as well as the method above. Only problem is that it is hard to store and impossible to sell. And you waste alot of seeds.

## Chapter 2: (Making crack cocaine)

The only item you will need that you can't find in stores is cocaine. All the others you can find at any grocery store. The best way to get cocaine, if you don't have a dealer, is to talk to a hooker. They have the hook up.

### Items needed:

1. Cocaine
2. Arm & Hammer Baking Soda
3. The I.Q. higher then a household plant.

### How to make it:

Crack is usually made by mixing two parts of cocaine with one part baking soda in about 20 ml of water. The solution is then heated gently until white precipitates form. Heating is halted when precipitation stops. The precipitate is filtered and retained. The precipitate may then be washed with water; this procedure is usually omitted in the street product. The product may then be dried for 24 hours under a heat lamp. Crack is then cut or broken into small 'rocks' weighing a few tenths of a gram.

### The Best Damn Crack Recipe Ever:

You need a lab to do this!

### Ingredients:

- 15 grams Cocaine
- 18 ounces Grand Marnier Liqueur (anything close)
- 18 ounces Famous Grouse Scotch (any scotch)
- 18 ounces Pellegrino sparkling mineral water (any sparkling water)
- 1/2 teaspoon Coriander
- 5 grams Rexal Formula III Baking Powder (baking soda will do)

### Equipment:

- Vulcon Quantum-QM100 Large Capacity Centrifuge
- Electrothermal Bunsen burner
- 24 50 ml Belco 3037-Graduated, Shallow Cone Bottom Centrifuge tubes
- Large Tupperware container

### Instructions:

Mix the cocaine, Grand Marnier, & Famous Grouse in the Tupperware container. Affix lid, make sure of tight seal, sit overnight in a cool dry place.

In the morning, mix in the Pellegrino, Baking Powder, & Coriander. Reserve 1/2 cup. Distribute mixture evenly in the 24 centrifuge tubes. Place tubes in Centrifuge for 15 minutes at 2885 RPM. Remove tubes and let sit overnight.

In the morning, add reserved mixture evenly to each tube, and place tubes in centrifuge for 45 minutes at 1500 RPM. Remove tubes and heat each tube individually with the Bunsen Burner for 15 minutes at 900 degrees Celsius. Let stand for 15 minutes, retrieve crack at bottom of each test tube. Smoke and enjoy! Serves 6, or one really desperate crackhead.
