REP. S. KELSH, FARGO Introduced the bill as a method for employers, in keeping with other regions of the country, to attract and hire college graduates in the area. It is designed to keep young people of North Dakota, to grow industries that are in demand. He stated he was working with the local economic development organization on this bill, and due to some special circumstances, the point person in Fargo was not able to get back to him regarding some information he received yesterday. This new information indicates that this bill would probably have little effect on the problem they are trying to solve. At this time, he recommended a do not pass of the bill.
