

Al Jaeger: There is a concern that on Election Day people can come to a polling location for different reasons. People should be able to go to and from a polling location and not be concerned about being approached. I expect that it has happened. We have had phone calls about it.

Rep. Haas: So there have been incidents where this has actually occurred.

Al Jaeger: Yes.

Rep. Potter: What you're adding here is just gather signatures for initiated measures, not getting signatures for anything else?

Al Jaeger: Yes.

Rep. Kasper: That is where I was going with this too. Are we going to prohibit this because the voters don't like being bothered initially. 100 feet is frankly not very far.

Al Jaeger: I would raise the question. You can't image the type of calls we get in our office.

Rep. Boehning: What are the penalties if you are within less than 100 feet.

Al Jaeger: I'm not sure, we don't have our book with.



All members of the committee were present.

Senator Dever, Chairman, opened the hearing on HB 1376.

Al Jaeger, Secretary of State, introduced the bill. See attachment # 1.

There was discussion about concern over the phrase "for any reason" being too broad. Would it restrict activities of other groups that may be sharing the facility on Election Day? They discussed the buffer zone of 100 ft from the entrance to the polling place and that the intention of the establishment of the buffer zone was to prevent harassment of voters. There was discussion about how to word this bill to accomplish what is intended.

Chairman Dever closed the hearing on HB1376.

JOB # 3764 Chairman Dever opened discussion on HB 1376.

Senator Oehlke pointed out the wording of HB 1376 on page 1, lines 18 through 23.

Senator Lee said approach on line 18 is the operative word. It makes a difference if it is a passive opportunity as compared to an active opportunity.

There was discussion about whether the election inspectors and judges have any control over harassment of voters outside the doors of the polling place. Al Jaeger said they can always call law enforcement if there is a need.

JOB # 3770 Chairman Dever opened discussion on HB1376.

There was discussion about possibly adding the word actively before the word approach on line 18 on page 1 of the bill. The intention of not allowing interference with the election process was reiterated.

RE: HB 1376 – Corrupt Election Practices

Section 1, page 1, line 7: This is a style and form change made by the Legislative Council.

Section 1, page 1, line 13: The change adds "web sites" to the existing list where a person is prohibited from publishing false information about a candidate for public office.

Section 2, page 1, lines 21 thru 23: This change creates a buffer zone at polling places for the gathering of signatures for a measure
