Minutes:

Chm. Svedjan called the meeting of the Full House Appropriations Committee to order.

Chm. Svedjan opened the hearing on HB 1522. The clerk called the roll and read the bill title.

Rep. Martinson motioned for a Do Pass. **Rep. Carlisle** seconded the motion.

Chm. Svedjan: Is there any discussion?

Rep. Gulleason: It would probably be a good idea to hear a little bit about the scope of the bill.

Rep. Berg, House Majority Leader described the bill.

Rep. Berg: This is an OMB bill that was killed in the Senate. It basically has the OMB budget as it was presented with one exception. The \$531,000 was changed to \$581,000 on page 3, line 3. It was my understanding that that got reviewed in the House and it was short of funds for membership in the legal . . .

Chm. Svedjan: Any questions? Further discussion?

Rep. Glassheim: The capital building fund, is that for any designated purpose? Is that for this building?

Jim Smith, Legislative Council: That's what was in the Governor's budget for OMB I believe for maintenance of the capitol ground.

Rep. Carlson: To the best of my recollection, that was for some work in the great hall, a new heating system for the old part of the Heritage Center, some carpet replacement. This number does reconcile with the list of five or six items.

Rep. Wald: Can somebody explain \$36 million for Centers of Excellence?

Chm. Svedjan: You're looking at what was appropriated last time. That's out of there.

The motion for a Do Pass to HB 1522 carried by a roll call vote of 23 ayes, 0 nays and 1 absent and not voting. Rep. Carlson was designated to carry the bill.

Rep. Skarphol: Can we discuss one other topic?

Chm. Svedjan: I would rather we do that later.

Chm. Svedjan adjourned the meeting.



Minutes:

Chairman Holmberg opened the hearing on HB 1522 indicated we will hear the bill, add an amendment which would set a transfer from the permanent oil trust fund to the general fund. The tax bill is still out so we are not sure what the total amount of money will be to transfer from that fund to the general fund will be to get an ending fund balance. So this amendment will transfer \$96 million from the permanent oil trust fund to the general fund. If we adopt that as of this moment at the end of the biennium there would be \$200 million in the budget stabilization fund, \$155.7 in the permanent oil trust fund, and an ending fund balance of \$20 million. That is a moving target and will not be resolved until SB 2032 has been resolved and we will bring that on the floor and if there needs to be a change in the number we will do a floor amendment. HB 1522 came with many pages, came back with more pages, and now is here. This is the last hearing of this Legislative session in either house.

Senator Mathern asked what the boys and girl's club work is for \$53,000 on page three.

Pam Sharp indicated that has been in the bill several biennium for money to go to each county. The county treasurer gets a check for this of \$500 for children's clubs.

Chairman Holmberg asked about the state memberships and that is CST. The response was that is the council of state government, national governor's association, western governor's association, education

commission, council on uniforms statewide is the bulk of them. The one change in House is the commission on uniform state laws that was changed because uniform and dues go up.

Senator Krauter asked if I call my county treasurer now, I don't know if they will tell me what they do with the \$500. Can you tell me?

Pam Sharp indicated they are not required to come back and document what they use it for. I don't know what they are doing with the funding other than statute says what they can do with it.

Sheila indicated it is for 4-h and is part of the extension service sent for achievement days, statute was changed several biennium ago.

Senator Robinson in sect 5 the capital building fund can you bring us up to date as to where is the money for refinishing of brass in the capitol.

Pam indicated that is still in the budget. There is a \$750,000 amount in trust that the capitol is able to use. They prioritize what the repairs are.

Senator Christmann just sends a message to OMB now that I know about that, I will not object to that money being taken from capital fund.

Senator Mathern questioned if we should increase boys and girls clubs.

Chairman Holmberg indicated he would not be adverse to that in another session but not this one.

Chairman Holmberg distributed amendments about the preliminary ending fund balance transfer and it is intentional not to vote on the bill until end of session.

Senator Bowman moved do pass the amendment, **Senator Fischer** seconded. An oral vote was taken resulting in a pass.

Senator Grindberg moved a do pass as amended, Senator Fischer seconded. A roll call vote was taken resulting in 14 yes votes, 0 no, 0 absent. The motion carried. Senator Holmberg will carry the bill.
