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Minutes:

**Chairman DeKrey:** We will open the hearing on HCR 3050.

**Rep. Bill Kretschmar:** Sponsor, introduced the bill. This resolution asked for a study of how legislative vacancies are filled. I don't think our present system is a good one. I think most of the people of our state would like to elect their legislators. They do it at each biennium election. When the constitution was changed to allow the Legislature to set up the system of how vacancies in the Legislature were filled, the Legislature adopted the system that we now have in law of appointing persons to fill legislative vacancies. Prior to that, legislative vacancies were filled by special elections or elections. They were to be called by the Governor and then you go through the election process. I can remember in one of the sessions in which I served, an elected legislator was accused of corrupt practices and buying all the drinks for the boys, that was the allegation. The evidence was strong and that person probably before the organizational session, resigned as legislator-elect. There was a vacancy in that district and it was filled at an election in January, probably before the first half of January was over and a new legislator then came into the House of Representatives. That's how things worked back then. Under present law, the district committee of the party of the vacated position picks a successor. Just in this last election cycle, in November, when Sen. Trenbeath, who was a

holdover senator even, accepted a position in the AG's office and resigned from the State Senate, and their district party then appointed Sen. Olson to fill that position. I think the system can work in that timeframe so that those appointments could be made. However, now if a vacancy occurs this year, say in the middle of June, I don't think it would be necessary to appoint someone to fill that position, unless the Governor would call a Special Session of the Legislature, they could wait until that position, at the election in 2008. It would then be filled by the vote of the people of the district. That is even more pronounced if the vacancy occurred in April of 2008. The election process is under way and somebody could get on the ballot in those districts and there would be no need in my judgment at least, for appointing someone to fill the spot in the meantime. There have been instances where the appointed person didn't win the election. I think once it was even in the primary election. I think the Legislature would be wise for a study of our system to see if there are times/framework in which an appointment need not be made, because of the timing of the vacancy and when it occurred. I think there is a temptation if someone is going to resign from the legislature to wait until the opportune time to do it so that the party can choose someone who they think can win the election. That basically is what HCR 3050 would be if chosen for study and approved by this committee and legislature.

**Rep. Meyer:** What is the timeframe, what happens when someone dies and they are running for office, and the election is in November. Let's say they died in September or October.

**Rep. Kretschmar:** I believe there is provision in the law for the party organization of that district to get someone else on the ballot to run in the election. If a vacancy occurs, say toward the end of Thanksgiving and we're going to have an organizational session in December, there

I think the appointee system may have a claim to have something done, because the legislature is coming up. But in the interims, it just seems to me that it would be far better to

set up a system that would require an election, in the next successive election rather than appointing someone in that interim period.

**Chairman DeKrey:** Thank you. Further testimony in support. Testimony in opposition. We will close the hearing.
