Chairman Ruby opened the hearing on HB 1152.

**Matthew Larsgaard**, MBA, Automobile Dealers Association of North Dakota, testified in favor of HB 1152. He provided written testimony. See attachment #1.

**Chairman Ruby**: When we updated the dealership laws and requirements there was a lot of discussion about keeping the records, the format, etc. What was the reason that we specified that the records had to be kept in one location?

**Matthew Larsgaard:** When this chapter (39:22), the dealer licensing law, was established, it was before my time. It is my understanding that the records were required to be kept at THE established place of business in an effort to help mitigate any impropriety that a dealer may attempt. This law also applies to used car dealers, not just new car dealerships.

**Representative Delmore:** Would there be electronic means to getting information at different branches of the main dealership?

**Matthew Larsgaard:** That is exactly the case. The dealers that will be able to utilize this bill, if passed, are the professional dealers that own multiple stores.

**Tom Balzer, North Dakota Motor Carriers Association** spoke to indicate the **N**orth Dakota Motor Carriers are also very much in support of this bill.

Linda Sitz, Director of Motor Vehicle, North Dakota Department of Transportation, spoke in support of HB 1152. She provided written testimony. See attachment # 2

There was no further support for HB 1152. There was no testimony in opposition to HB 1152.
