2:08 **Representative M. Nelson:** I noticed that if the bill is not paid within 30 days, it starts drawing interest. If a company requests a hearing, how long would it take to have that hearing?

Illona Jeffcoat-Sacco: It would take about a month. You would have to permit notice. There could be two parties, and the second party would need a notice of at least twenty days. You'd have the hearing after that. We have not been assessing interest.

Chairman Keiser: Are you suggesting we should amend it to take that out?

Illona Jeffcoat-Sacco: I do not have authority to suggest that. But if you decide that that is what you'd like to do, I would quickly get a response to you by the end of the day by the commission.

Chairman Keiser: Where is that exactly in the bill?

Illona Jeffcoat-Sacco: Lines 18 and 19. I should say that if a company requested a hearing, the commission would not consider the bill due.

TESTIMONY

Mister Chairman and committee members, I am Illona Jeffcoat-Sacco, General Counsel with the Public Service Commission. The Commission asked me to appear today in support of Senate Bill 2055, introduced at our request.

Senate Bill 2055 is basically a housekeeping bill that includes no changes to any substantive areas of our jurisdiction. Senate Bill 2055 simply allows the Commission to send out the bills for telecommunications case expenses via regular paper or electronic mail rather than via certified mail.

As you may recall, the costs incurred by the Commission in processing telecommunications cases can be billed to the parties involved through the Commission's Public Utility Valuation Fund. Existing statutory language requires these bills to be sent to the affected companies via certified mail or personal delivery. The bill deletes the certified mail requirement and replaces it with electronic or paper mail.

In addition, the Senate Bill 2055 moves the company's opportunity to request a hearing from before the bill is sent to the company to after the bill is

sent, but before it is paid. Providing an opportunity for hearing before the bill is sent implies two notifications to a company for one bill (one to allow the opportunity for hearing and one for payment). It seems more logical, and less cumbersome, to provide the company an opportunity to challenge the amount of the bill once the company receives the bill. In practice, to my knowledge, no company has ever requested a hearing on a bill.
