Dear Chairman Longmuir and members of the House Political Subdivisions Committee,

I am writing as a citizen and am neutral on HB1257. HB1257 was “authored” (a school English teacher would have another word) in January 2023 using HB1116 as a template with a very slight unwanted modification. The work on this bill language was done by others and not the sponsors of this HB1257. The current version is so word-for-word, little effort has been expended by HB1257 sponsors, so I am unsure how well the HB1257 sponsors will be able to answer questions on its content and shepherd this bill through the legislature. I am unsure of their investment in their own bill with little expended work of their own.

I would recommend passage of the other bill, HB1116, as its sponsor and his citizen advocate are invested in the nearly identical bill language they initially authored. If the sponsors of HB1257 wanted to withdraw their bill at any point in the legislative process, the people who had the initial idea of school campaign finance legislation would have little influence to stop. Therefore, HB1116 should be supported, and I have no recommendation on HB1257.

My testimony on this bill is neutral.

The League of Women Voters of North Dakota (LWVND) submits this testimony in support of House Bill 1257. We appreciate the opportunity to share our perspective.

HB 1257 amends a section of the ND Century Code so that candidates for school district office (in school districts with a fall enrollment of 750 or more) will be required to submit campaign contribution statements.

**LWVND supports this bill** for three reasons. The bill:

- 1) ensures that candidates for school district office are held to the same standard of financial transparency and compliance as candidates for other public offices in North Dakota,
- 2) gives school district voters an additional, and important, piece of information when deciding on preferred candidates,
- 3) is consistent with the LWVND's focus on empowering voters.

We understand that a similar bill, HB 1116, introduced by Representative Hoverson, connects the campaign contribution statement requirement to the district population rather than the fall school enrollment number. **Testimony of Alexis Baxley**

Good morning Chairman Longmuir and members of the House Political Subdivisions Committee. My name is Alexis Baxley, and I serve as the executive director of the North Dakota School Boards Association. NDSBA represents the elected school boards of all 170 public school districts and several special education units in North Dakota.

NDSBA is supportive of election transparency. We appreciate the language requiring submission of the statement to the school district business manager. This is appropriate because business managers already collect school board candidates' statements of intent and other election documents.

We also appreciate the approach taken by Representative Conmy in regards to the limitation. As you know, candidates for city office must only submit a campaign finance report in cities with populations greater than 5,000. We feel this is a reasonable point of differentiation, but it would not work well for school districts. The of a school district is a more complicated number to figure than in a city or county. We know where our kids are – we do not always know the population of other properties within a school district. School districts do not always neatly follow the borders of cities or counties. In fact, I am aware of at least one school district that includes territory in eight – yes eight – different counties. Calculating district population would likely require school business managers to work with multiple county auditors to tally a population number. For this reason, Representative Conmy's use of school enrollment is much more appropriate. This data is readily available to districts and a number we always know. I have included in my testimony North Dakota city populations from the 2020 census. I have also included public school district enrollment from the fall of this current school year. I believe an equivalent enrollment number to a population of 5,000 would be 1,000 students. I also believe it is important that we identify a precise date of enrollment, as district enrollments shift on a daily basis in some districts. I have included a suggested amendment on the next page of my testimony. The suggested amendment language references the "September tenth fall enrollment report." School districts file this report annually, and it is the enrollment number used to calculate a district's state aid. My proposed language also includes the enrollment of 1,000 students previously mentioned. I appreciate your consideration.

Page 3, 16.1-08.1-02.3, sub 5

*5. A candidate for city office in a city with a population under five thousand and a candidate committee for the candidate are exempt from this section. A candidate for school district office in a school district with an enrollment of less than 1,000 students as reflected in the district's most recent September tenth fall enrollment report ~~a population under five thousand~~ and a candidate committee for the candidate are exempt from this section.*

### 327B Political Subdivisions

#### HB 1257

Chairman Longmuir, Committee members.

For the record, I'm Representative Liz Conmy from District 11 in Fargo.

I'm here to present House Bill 1257 which regards campaign contributions for candidates seeking an elected position on a school district's board of education. You may have heard, this bill is very similar to House Bill 1116... which you will hear later. From my perspective, this bill is the better bill.

Bill 1257 requires candidates for school board be required to file a campaign finance report, but only in districts where the student enrollment is over 750 students,

Today, North Dakota law requires candidates for statewide office, the state legislature, county commission, and city commission to file campaign finance reports which includes the total amount they receive and itemized donations of amounts over \$200. This bill would apply the exact same requirements to school board candidates in larger school districts, similar to how only candidates for city commission races in larger cities must file a report.

This bill is the result of constituents concerns following recent school board elections in Fargo. With greater interest in school board elections, and the increase in campaign contributions, it makes sense to ask candidates to provide the source of their campaign funds. In the last election in Fargo, with no requirement regarding reporting of donations to school board candidates, the Forum asked candidates to share the information with them willingly in the last election in Fargo, which many of them did. It is in the voter's best interest to have this information.

HB 1257 adds a provision requiring school district candidates to file a campaign contribution statement (Page 1, lines 10 and 11 in section 1). The reports would be filed with the school district business manager 64 days prior to the election.

HB 1257 also adds a school district enrollment population number that determines which districts candidates must file a campaign contribution statement. On page 3, lines 25 through 28, you'll see that a district with a fall enrollment of 750 students or less would NOT have to file, and would be exempt from this section. The reason for this is simple. In smaller communities it is hard enough to get candidates to run—and we do not want to discourage participation or add a burden to a small community.

Page 4, lines 1 through 4, states that a candidate for a school district office would file with the school district business manager.

Page 5, line 20, states that candidates for school district offices are exempt from audits from the Secretary of State as are county office seekers.

There are currently 18 school districts in North Dakota that this would affect. If we were to put the requirement for reporting at 1000 students instead of 750, that would cut the list to 15 schools.

I believe adding campaign reporting requirements to districts with over 750 students provides necessary transparency for larger districts without unduly burdening smaller school districts. And most importantly, it lets voter know who is trying to influence their vote.

**House Bill 1257**  
**Senate State and Local Government Committee**

The League of Women Voters of North Dakota (LWVND) submits this testimony **in support of House Bill 1257**. We appreciate the opportunity to share our perspective.

HB 1257 amends a section of the ND Century Code so that candidates for school district office (in school districts with a fall enrollment of 750 or more) will be required to submit campaign contribution statements.

**LWVND supports this bill** for three reasons. The bill:

1. ensures that candidates for school district office are held to the same standard of financial transparency and compliance as candidates for other public offices in North Dakota,
2. gives school district voters an additional, and important, piece of information when deciding on preferred candidates,
3. is consistent with the LWVND's focus on empowering voters.

We understand that a similar bill, HB 1116, introduced by Representative Hoverson, connects the campaign contribution statement requirement to the district population rather than the fall school enrollment number. We hope the Committee will consult with the ND Secretary of State and/or the ND School Boards Association to determine the most appropriate standard for this requirement.

LWVND wishes to thank Representative Conmy and the other sponsors for submitting this bill, and we ask the Committee to vote in its favor.

I'm here to present HB 1257 regarding reporting campaign contributions for candidates seeking an elected position on a school district's school board. HC 1257 requires candidates for school board to file a campaign finance report, but only in districts where the student enrollment is over 750 students.

Currently, North Dakota law requires candidates for statewide office, the state legislature, county commission, and city commission to file campaign finance reports which include the total amount they receive and itemized donations of amounts over \$200. This bill would apply the exact same requirements to school board candidates in larger school districts, similar to how candidates for city commission races in larger cities must file a report.

This bill is the result of constituent's concerns following recent school board elections in both Grand Forks and Fargo. With greater interest in school board elections, and in campaign contributions that influence the elections, it makes sense to ask candidates to provide the source of their campaign funds. In the last election in Fargo, with no requirement regarding reporting of donations to school board candidates, the Forum asked candidates to share the information with them, which many of them did. It is in the voter's best interest to have this information.

The reports would be filed with the school district business manager 64 days prior to the election. School districts with a fall enrollment of 750 students or less would NOT have to file and would be exempt from this section. The reason for this is simple. In smaller communities it is hard enough to get candidates to run, and we do not want to discourage participation or add a burden to a small community.

There are currently 18 school districts in North Dakota that this would affect. If we were to put the requirement for reporting at 1000 students instead of 750, that would cut the list to 15 schools.

OF NOTE: This bill is very similar to House Bill 1116, with one important difference—HB 1257 limits the reporting requirement to school districts with an enrollment of over 750 students. HB 1257 passed the House with 72 yeas and 20 nays. HB 1116 passed the House with 55 yeas and 37 nays and would require districts with 500 or more students to file campaign contribution reports.

Considering the increased interest in school board elections, it is important to let voters know who is trying to influence their vote, and this bill does that.

**Testimony of Alexis Baxley**

Good morning Chair Roers and members of the Senate State and Local Government Committee. My name is Alexis Baxley, and I serve as the executive director of the North Dakota School Boards Association. NDSBA represents the elected school boards of all 170 public school districts and several special education units in North Dakota.

NDSBA is supportive of election transparency. We appreciate the language requiring submission of the statement to the school district business manager. This is appropriate because business managers already collect school board candidates' statements of intent and other election documents.

We also appreciate the approach taken by Representative Conmy in regards to the limitation. As you know, candidates for city office must only submit a campaign finance report in cities with populations greater than 5,000. We feel this is a reasonable point of differentiation, but it would not work well for school districts. The of a school district is a more complicated number to figure than in a city or county. We know where our kids are – we do not always know the population of other properties within a school district. School districts do not always neatly follow the borders of cities or counties. In fact, I am aware of at least one school district that includes territory in eight – yes eight – different counties. Calculating district population would likely require school business managers to work with multiple county auditors to tally a population number. For this reason, Representative Conmy's use of school enrollment is much more appropriate. This data is readily available to districts and a number we always know. I have included in my testimony North Dakota city populations from the 2020 census. I have also included public school district enrollment from the fall of this current school year. I believe an equivalent enrollment number to a population of 5,000 would be 1,000 students. I also believe it is important that we identify a precise date of enrollment, as district enrollments shift on a daily basis in some districts. I have included a suggested amendment on the next page of my testimony. The suggested amendment language references the "September tenth fall enrollment report." School districts file this report annually, and it is the enrollment number used to calculate a district's state aid. My proposed language also includes the enrollment of 1,000 students previously mentioned. I appreciate your consideration.

*5. A candidate for city office in a city with a population under five thousand and a candidate committee for the candidate are exempt from this section. A candidate for school district office in a school district with ~~a fall~~ an enrollment of less than ~~seven hundred fifty~~ 1,000 students as reflected in the district's most recent September tenth fall enrollment report and a candidate committee for the candidate are exempt from this section.*
