NOTICE OF INTENT TO AMEND ADMINISTRATIVE RULES

TAKE NOTICE that the North Dakota Board of Podiatric Medicine will hold a public hearing to address proposed amendments to N.D. Admin. Code 63-01-05-01, 63-02-08-01, 63-03-02-06, 63-03-03-01, 63-03-03-04 at 9:00 a.m. CDT on Tuesday, November 10, 2015 in the Red River Room, State Capitol, Bismarck, North Dakota. The purpose of the proposed amendments is to bring the Administrative Code into compliance with current North Dakota Century Code statutes (HB 1098, SB 2067 & SB 2128) and board policies and practices. The proposed amendments address the definition of podiatric medicine, fees, continuing medical education, licensure non-renewal and reinstatement. The proposed amendments are not expected to have an impact on the regulated community in excess of \$50,000.00. These are not emergency rules.

The proposed rules may be reviewed at the office of the North Dakota Board of Podiatric Medicine, at 4309 Kodiak Place, Bismarck, North Dakota 58503. Written or oral comments on the proposed rules sent to the above address, email or telephone number and received by November 24, 2015 will be fully considered.
