New constitution alternative propositions on 1972 special election ballot
Alter. Prop. (Con. Conv.)

Maintain two-house legislature

Approved

Adopt a one-house legislature

Rejected

Require 2 percent of population's signatures for initiative and referendum and 4 percent of state's signatures for initiated constitutional amendment; 25 sponsors required; petition form must be approved by Secretary of State before petitions are circulated (or)

Approved

Require 10,000 signatures for initiative; 7,000 signatures for referendum; 20,000 signatures for initiated constitutional amendment; and five sponsors required

Rejected

Declare persons 18 years of age or older to be adults for all purposes

Rejected

Prohibit the Legislative Assembly from having any power to authorize lotteries or gift enterprises for any purpose and instruct legislators to enact laws to prohibit the sale of lottery or gift enterprise tickets

Rejected

The alternative propositions if approved would only take effect if the 1972 constitution itself were approved. It was not. Alternative propositions had no effect.
