HB 1190: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 20.1-03 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to hunting by nonresident and foreign exchange students; and to amend and reenact sections 20.1-03-07 and 20.1-03-07.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to hunting by nonresidents and nonresident waterfowl hunting licenses.

HB 1191: A BILL for an Act to create and enact section 28-32-03.4 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to authority of the committee on administrative rules to call up existing administrative rules for review; to amend and reenact subsection 1 of section 28-32-03.3 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to authority of the committee on administrative rules to void or object to administrative rules; and to provide an effective date.

Was read the first time and referred to the Government and Veterans Affairs Committee.

Reps. Skarphol, Monson, Byerly and Sen. B. Stenehjem introduced:

HB 1192: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 9 of section 39-06.1-06 and section 39-21-41.5 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to safety belt violations.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Transportation Committee**.

Reps. Skarphol, Wald, Price and Sen. Andrist introduced:

HB 1193: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 34-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to references by employers.
