Was read the first time and referred to the Finance and Taxation Committee.

**SB 2079:** A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new subsection to section 61-04-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the definition of rural water system; and to amend and reenact sections 61-04-06.2, 61-04-23, 61-04-24, and 61-04-25 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to forfeiture of water rights held by rural water supply systems.

Was read the first time and referred to the Natural Resources Committee.

**SB 2083:** A BILL for an Act to provide for the continuation of an agricultural pesticide and pesticide container disposal program; and to provide an expiration date.

Was read the first time and referred to the Agriculture Committee.

**SB 2096:** A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15-21 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to mediation between school districts and parents of students.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Education Committee**.

**SB 2100:** A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 54-52.3-01 and 54-52.3-03 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to participation by district health units in the pretax benefits program.

Was read the first time and referred to the Government and Veterans Affairs Committee.
